- AN ACT Relating to animal identification programs; amending 2006 c 150 s 1 (uncodified); providing an effective date; providing an
- 3 expiration date; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** 2006 c 150 s 1 (uncodified) is amended to read as follows:
- 6 (1) The director of agriculture shall convene an advisory committee 7 composed of representatives from the various segments of the cattle
- 8 industry that will be involved in the implementation of the state's
- 9 component of the national animal identification program for animal
- 10 health and disease trace-back purposes. The advisory committee shall
- 11 be chaired by the director of agriculture or the director's appointee.
- 12 In making the appointments to the advisory committee, the director
- 13 shall consult with organizations that represent the affected segments
- 14 of the cattle industry. The director may appoint additional members to
- 15 the advisory committee as deemed necessary. The director shall appoint
- 16 to the advisory committee one member from a federally recognized tribe
- 17 who is in the cattle industry.
- 18 (2) The advisory committee shall evaluate the (($\frac{requirements}{of}$)
- 19 the)) voluntary federal program and examine approaches being taken by

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- other states to implement ((the requirements)) a program, with an 1 2 emphasis on neighboring states and the states that engage in the largest amount of trade in cattle with Washington, and evaluate 3 demonstration projects that the department shall conduct at two or more 4 facilities that handle large numbers of animals. 5 The advisory committee shall make a recommendation on how the <u>voluntary</u> federal 6 7 ((requirements)) program should be implemented in Washington that includes recommended funding amounts and sources. In developing a 8 9 funding proposal, the advisory committee shall consult with the office 10 of financial management.
- 11 (3) The department shall submit ((a)) written reports of the activities and recommendations of the advisory committee to the house of representatives and to the senate by December 1, 2006, and December 1, 2007.
- 15 (4) This section expires July 1, $((\frac{2007}{}))$ 2008.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect June 30, 2007.

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
