- 2 revolving fund; adding new sections to chapter 43.10 RCW; repealing RCW

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. RCW 43.330.190 (Reimbursement of
- 6 extraordinary criminal justice costs) and 1999 c 303 s 1 are each
- 7 repealed.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 43.10 RCW
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 There is hereby created the extraordinary criminal justice
- 11 revolving fund in the custody of the state treasurer for the purpose of
- 12 reimbursing counties the extraordinary criminal justice costs
- 13 associated with aggravated murder cases.
- 14 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 43.10 RCW
- 15 to read as follows:
- The attorney general is authorized to expend from the extraordinary

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- 1 criminal justice revolving fund, such funds as are necessary to
- 2 reimburse the counties the extraordinary criminal justice costs
- 3 associated with aggravated murder cases.

- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 43.10 RCW to read as follows:
 - (1) Counties may submit a petition for relief to the attorney general for reimbursement of extraordinary criminal justice costs. Extraordinary criminal justice costs are defined as those associated with investigation, prosecution, indigent defense, jury impanelment, expert witnesses, interpreters, incarceration, and other adjudication costs of aggravated murder cases.
 - (2) The attorney general is responsible for the distribution of funds from the extraordinary criminal justice revolving fund and shall, in consultation with the Washington association of prosecuting attorneys and the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs, develop procedures for processing the petitions, auditing the veracity of the petitions, and prioritizing the petitions. Prioritization of the petitions shall be based on, but not limited to, such factors as disproportionate fiscal impact relative to the county budget, efficient use of resources, and whether the costs are extraordinary and could not be reasonably accommodated and anticipated in the normal budget process.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. The sum of five million dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008, from the general fund to the extraordinary criminal justice revolving fund for the purposes of this act.

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
