AN ACT Relating to theft of public benefits by the use of a false identity; amending RCW 9A.56.320, 13.40.0357, and 46.20.0921; reenacting and amending RCW 9.94A.515 and 9A.82.010; adding a new section to chapter 9.35 RCW; and prescribing penalties.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 9.35 RCW 7 to read as follows:

8 (1) No person may obtain or attempt to obtain, or aid or abet any 9 person in obtaining, any financial public benefit to which the person 10 is not entitled by the use of a false identity with the intent to 11 deceive an officer, employee, or agent of the state or a local 12 government into providing the financial public benefit.

(2)(a) Violation of this section when the accused or an accomplice uses a false identity and obtains an aggregate total of public benefit payments in excess of one thousand five hundred dollars constitutes theft of public benefits in the first degree. Theft of public benefits in the first degree is a class B felony punishable according to chapter 9A.20 RCW. 1 (b) Violation of this section when the accused or an accomplice 2 uses a false identity and obtains an aggregate total of public benefit 3 payments of one thousand five hundred dollars or less constitutes theft 4 of public benefits in the second degree. Theft of public benefits in 5 the second degree is a class C felony punishable according to chapter 6 9A.20 RCW.

7 (3) A person who violates this section is liable to the state 8 agency or local government that provided the financial public benefit 9 for civil damages of one thousand dollars or actual damages, whichever 10 is greater.

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(4) For the purposes of this section:

12 (a) "Financial public benefit" means any financial benefit provided 13 by the state of Washington or a local government, including but not 14 limited to, temporary assistance for needy families, chapter 74.12 RCW; unemployment insurance benefits, chapter 50.20 RCW; 15 industrial insurance benefits, chapter 51.32 RCW; the basic health plan, chapter 16 17 70.47 RCW; and higher education financial aid programs, Title 28B RCW. (b) "Use of a false identity" means use of impersonation, a false 18 name, a false social security number, or other false identification. 19

(ii) In the name of a fictitious person or entity, or with a fictitious routing number or account number of a person or entity, with intent to use the payment instruments to commit theft, forgery, or identity theft.

(b) (a)(i) of this subsection does not apply to:

(i) A person or financial institution that has lawful possession of
 a check, which is endorsed to that person or financial institution; and
 (ii) A person or financial institution that processes checks for a
 lawful business purpose.

22 (3) A person is guilty of unlawful possession of a personal 23 identification device if the person possesses a personal identification 24 device with intent to use such device to commit theft, forgery, theft of public benefits, or identity theft. "Personal identification 25 device" includes any machine or instrument whose purpose is to 26 27 manufacture or print any driver's license or identification card issued by any state or the federal government, or any employee identification 28 issued by any employer, public or private, including but not limited to 29 badges and identification cards, or any credit or debit card. 30

(4) A person is guilty of unlawful possession of fictitious identification if the person possesses a personal identification card with a fictitious person's identification with intent to use such identification card to commit theft, forgery, <u>theft of public benefits</u>, or identity theft, when the possession does not amount to a violation of RCW 9.35.020.

37 (5) A person is guilty of unlawful possession of instruments of38 financial fraud if the person possesses a check-making machine,

equipment, or software, with intent to use or distribute checks for purposes of defrauding an account holder, business, financial institution, or any other person or organization.

4 (6) This section does not apply to:

5 (a) A person, business, or other entity, that has lawful possession 6 of a check, which is endorsed to that person, business, or other 7 entity;

8 (b) A financial institution or other entity that processes checks9 for a lawful business purpose;

10 (c) A person engaged in a lawful business who obtains another 11 person's personal identification in the ordinary course of that lawful 12 business;

(d) A person who obtains another person's personal identificationfor the sole purpose of misrepresenting his or her age; and

(e) A law enforcement agency that produces or displays counterfeit
 credit or debit cards, checks or other payment instruments, or personal
 identification devices for investigative or educational purposes.

18 (7) In a proceeding under this section that is related to an 19 identity theft under RCW 9.35.020, the crime will be considered to have 20 been committed in any locality where the person whose means of 21 identification or financial information was appropriated resides, or in 22 which any part of the offense took place, regardless of whether the 23 defendant was ever actually in that locality.

(8) A violation of this section is a class C felony.

8 (2) "Control" means the possession of a sufficient interest to 9 permit substantial direction over the affairs of an enterprise.

13 (4) "Criminal profiteering" means any act, including any 14 anticipatory or completed offense, committed for financial gain, that is chargeable or indictable under the laws of the state in which the 15 act occurred and, if the act occurred in a state other than this state, 16 17 would be chargeable or indictable under the laws of this state had the act occurred in this state and punishable as a felony and by 18 imprisonment for more than one year, regardless of whether the act is 19 charged or indicted, as any of the following: 20

15 (5) "Dealer in property" means a person who buys and sells property 16 as a business.

17 (6) "Debtor" means a person to whom an extension of credit is made 18 or a person who guarantees the repayment of an extension of credit or 19 in any manner undertakes to indemnify the creditor against loss 20 resulting from the failure of a person to whom an extension is made to 21 repay the same.

(7) "Documentary material" means any book, paper, document, writing, drawing, graph, chart, photograph, phonograph record, magnetic tape, computer printout, other data compilation from which information can be obtained or from which information can be translated into usable form, or other tangible item.

(8) "Enterprise" includes any individual, sole proprietorship, partnership, corporation, business trust, or other profit or nonprofit legal entity, and includes any union, association, or group of individuals associated in fact although not a legal entity, and both illicit and licit enterprises and governmental and nongovernmental entities.

(9) "Extortionate extension of credit" means an extension of credit with respect to which it is the understanding of the creditor and the debtor at the time the extension is made that delay in making repayment or failure to make repayment could result in the use of violence or other criminal means to cause harm to the person, reputation, or property of any person. (10) "Extortionate means" means the use, or an express or implicit
 threat of use, of violence or other criminal means to cause harm to the
 person, reputation, or property of any person.

4 (11) "Financial institution" means any bank, trust company, savings
5 and loan association, savings bank, mutual savings bank, credit union,
6 or loan company under the jurisdiction of the state or an agency of the
7 United States.

(12) "Pattern of criminal profiteering activity" means engaging in 8 at least three acts of criminal profiteering, one of which occurred 9 after July 1, 1985, and the last of which occurred within five years, 10 excluding any period of imprisonment, after the commission of the 11 earliest act of criminal profiteering. In order to constitute a 12 pattern, the three acts must have the same or similar intent, results, 13 accomplices, principals, victims, or methods of commission, or be 14 otherwise interrelated by distinguishing characteristics including a 15 16 nexus to the same enterprise, and must not be isolated events. 17 However, in any civil proceedings brought pursuant to RCW 9A.82.100 by any person other than the attorney general or county prosecuting 18 attorney in which one or more acts of fraud in the purchase or sale of 19 securities are asserted as acts of criminal profiteering activity, it 20 21 is a condition to civil liability under RCW 9A.82.100 that the 22 defendant has been convicted in a criminal proceeding of fraud in the 23 purchase or sale of securities under RCW 21.20.400 or under the laws of 24 another state or of the United States requiring the same elements of 25 proof, but such conviction need not relate to any act or acts asserted 26 as acts of criminal profiteering activity in such civil action under 27 RCW 9A.82.100.

(13) "Real property" means any real property or interest in real property, including but not limited to a land sale contract, lease, or mortgage of real property.

31 (14) "Records" means any book, paper, writing, record, computer 32 program, or other material.

33 (15) "Repayment of an extension of credit" means the repayment, 34 satisfaction, or discharge in whole or in part of a debt or claim, 35 acknowledged or disputed, valid or invalid, resulting from or in 36 connection with that extension of credit.

37 (16) "Stolen property" means property that has been obtained by38 theft, robbery, or extortion.

(17) "To collect an extension of credit" means to induce in any way 1 2 a person to make repayment thereof.

(18) "To extend credit" means to make or renew a loan or to enter 3 into an agreement, tacit or express, whereby the repayment or 4 5 satisfaction of a debt or claim, whether acknowledged or disputed, valid or invalid, and however arising, may or shall be deferred. 6

7 (19) "Traffic" means to sell, transfer, distribute, dispense, or otherwise dispose of stolen property to another person, or to buy, 8 9 receive, possess, or obtain control of stolen property, with intent to 10 sell, transfer, distribute, dispense, or otherwise dispose of the 11 property to another person.

12 (20)(a) "Trustee" means:

13 (i) A person acting as a trustee under a trust established under 14 Title 11 RCW in which the trustee holds legal or record title to real 15 property;

16 (ii) A person who holds legal or record title to real property in 17 which another person has a beneficial interest; or

(iii) A successor trustee to a person who is a trustee under (a)(i) 18 or (ii) of this subsection. 19

(b) "Trustee" does not mean a person appointed or acting as: 20

21 (i) A personal representative under Title 11 RCW;

22 (ii) A trustee of any testamentary trust;

(iii) A trustee of any indenture of trust under which a bond is 23 24 issued; or

(iv) A trustee under a deed of trust. 25

(21) "Unlawful debt" means any money or other thing of value 26 27 constituting principal or interest of a debt that is legally unenforceable in the state in full or in part because the debt was 28 incurred or contracted: 29

(a) In violation of any one of the following: 30

(i) Chapter 67.16 RCW relating to horse racing; 31

32

(ii) Chapter 9.46 RCW relating to gambling;

(b) In a gambling activity in violation of federal law; or 33

(c) In connection with the business of lending money or a thing of 34 value at a rate that is at least twice the permitted rate under the 35 applicable state or federal law relating to usury. 36
