AN ACT Relating to radiologist assistants; amending RCW 18.84.010, 18.84.020, 18.84.030, 18.84.040, and 18.84.080; and adding new sections to chapter 18.84 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 18.84.010 and 1991 c 222 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 It is the intent and purpose of this chapter to protect the public 8 by the certification and registration of practitioners of radiological technology. By promoting high standards of professional performance, 9 10 by requiring professional accountability, and by credentialing those persons who seek to provide radiological technology under the title of 11 12 ((radiological)) radiologic technologists, and by regulating all 13 persons utilizing ionizing radiation on human beings this chapter identifies those practitioners who have achieved a particular level of 14 15 competency. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to require that individual or group policies or contracts of an insurance carrier, 16 health care service contractor, or health maintenance organization 17 provide benefits or coverage for services and supplies provided by a 18 19 person certified under this chapter.

1 The legislature finds and declares that this chapter conforms to 2 the guidelines, terms, and definitions for the credentialing of health 3 or health-related professions specified under chapter 18.120 RCW.

4 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.84.020 and 2000 c 93 s 42 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 ((Unless the context clearly requires otherwise,)) The definitions
7 in this section apply throughout this chapter <u>unless the context</u>
8 <u>clearly requires otherwise</u>.

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(1) "Department" means the department of health.

(2) "Secretary" means the secretary of health.

11 (3) "Licensed practitioner" means any licensed health care 12 practitioner performing services within the person's authorized scope 13 of practice.

14 (4) "Radiologic technologist" means an individual certified under 15 this chapter, other than a licensed practitioner, who practices 16 radiologic technology as a:

17 (a) Diagnostic radiologic technologist, who is a person who 18 actually handles X-ray equipment in the process of applying radiation 19 on a human being for diagnostic purposes at the direction of a licensed 20 practitioner, this includes parenteral procedures related to radiologic 21 technology when performed under the direct supervision of a physician 22 licensed under chapter 18.71 or 18.57 RCW; $((\Theta r))$

(b) Therapeutic radiologic technologist, who is a person who uses radiation-generating equipment for therapeutic purposes on human subjects at the direction of a licensed practitioner, this includes parenteral procedures related to radiologic technology when performed under the direct supervision of a physician licensed under chapter 18.71 or 18.57 RCW; ((or))

(c) Nuclear medicine technologist, who is a person who prepares radiopharmaceuticals and administers them to human beings for diagnostic and therapeutic purposes and who performs in vivo and in vitro detection and measurement of radioactivity for medical purposes at the direction of a licensed practitioner; or

34 (d) Radiologist assistant, who is an advanced-level certified 35 diagnostic radiologic technologist who practices under levels of 36 supervision defined by the secretary, and: (i) Enhances patient care by assisting the radiologist in the
 diagnostic imaging environment;

3 (ii) Performs advanced diagnostic procedures including injecting 4 agents that facilitate or enable diagnostic imaging, performs selected 5 diagnostic aspirations and needle localizations for biopsy under 6 radiologist direction and supervision, performs fluoroscopy, and 7 placing nasoenteric and oroenteric feeding tubes in uncomplicated 8 patients;

(iii) Monitors and tailors selected examinations;

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10 (iv) Communicates preliminary observations to a radiologist and 11 communicates final radiologist reports to referring health care 12 providers when directed;

13 (v) Performs selected peripheral venous diagnostic procedures; and 14 (vi) Assists radiologists with invasive procedures and performs 15 additional procedures under radiologist direction and supervision.

(5) "Approved school of radiologic technology" means a school of 16 17 radiologic technology or radiologist assistant program approved by the council on medical education of the American medical association or the 18 American registry of radiologic technologists or a school found to 19 maintain the equivalent of such a course of study as determined by the 20 21 department. Such school may be operated by a medical or educational 22 institution, and for the purpose of providing the requisite clinical experience, shall be affiliated with one or more general hospitals. 23

(6) "Radiologic technology" means the use of ionizing radiationupon a human being for diagnostic or therapeutic purposes.

(7) "Radiologist" means a physician certified by the American board
 of radiology or the American osteopathic board of radiology.

(8) "Registered X-ray technician" means a person who is registered with the department, and who applies ionizing radiation at the direction of a licensed practitioner and who does not perform parenteral procedures.

32 **Sec. 3.** RCW 18.84.030 and 1991 c 222 s 3 are each amended to read 33 as follows:

No person may practice radiologic technology without being registered or certified under this chapter, unless that person is a licensed practitioner as defined in RCW 18.84.020(3). A person represents himself or herself to the public as a certified

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1 ((radiological)) radiologic technologist when that person adopts or 2 uses a title or description of services that incorporates one or more 3 of the following items or designations:

4 (1) Certified radiologic technologist or CRT, for persons so5 certified under this chapter;

6 (2) Certified radiologic therapy technologist, CRTT, or CRT, for
7 persons certified in the therapeutic field;

8 (3) Certified radiologic diagnostic technologist, CRDT, or CRT, for
 9 persons certified in the diagnostic field; ((or))

10 (4) Certified nuclear medicine technologist, CNMT, or CRT, for 11 persons certified as nuclear medicine technologists<u>; or</u>

(5) Certified radiologist assistant or CRA for persons certified as
 radiologist assistants.

14 Sec. 4. RCW 18.84.040 and 1994 sp.s. c 9 s 506 are each amended to 15 read as follows:

16 (1) In addition to any other authority provided by law, the 17 secretary may:

(a) Adopt rules, in accordance with chapter 34.05 RCW, necessary to
 implement this chapter;

20 (b) Set all registration, certification, and renewal fees in 21 accordance with RCW 43.70.250;

(c) Establish forms and procedures necessary to administer thischapter;

(d) Evaluate and designate those schools from which graduation will
be accepted as proof of an applicant's eligibility to receive a
certificate;

(e) Determine whether alternative methods of training are equivalent to formal education, and to establish forms, procedures, and criteria for evaluation of an applicant's alternative training to determine the applicant's eligibility to receive a certificate;

31 (f) Prepare, grade, and administer, or determine the nature of, and 32 supervise the grading and administration of examinations for obtaining 33 <u>a certificate;</u>

34 (g) Issue a certificate to any applicant who has met the education, 35 training, <u>examination</u>, <u>preceptorship</u>, and conduct requirements for 36 certification; and

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1 (((g))) (h) Issue a registration to an applicant who meets the 2 requirement for a registration.

3 (2) The secretary may hire clerical, administrative, and
4 investigative staff as needed to implement this chapter.

5 (3) The <u>uniform disciplinary act</u>, chapter 18.130 RCW, governs the 6 issuance and denial of registrations and certifications, unregistered 7 and uncertified practice, and the discipline of registrants and 8 certificants under this chapter. The secretary is the disciplining 9 authority under this chapter.

10 (4) The secretary may appoint ad hoc members of the profession to 11 serve in an ad hoc advisory capacity to the secretary in carrying out 12 this chapter. The members will serve for designated times and provide 13 advice on matters specifically identified and requested by the 14 secretary. The members shall be compensated in accordance with RCW 15 43.03.220 and reimbursed for travel expenses under RCW 43.03.040 and 16 43.03.060.

17 **Sec. 5.** RCW 18.84.080 and 1991 c 3 s 209 are each amended to read 18 as follows:

(1) The secretary shall issue a certificate to any applicant who demonstrates to the secretary's satisfaction, that the following requirements have been met <u>to practice as</u>:

(a) <u>A diagnostic radiologic technologist, therapeutic radiologic</u>
 <u>technologist, or nuclear medicine technologist:</u>

24 (i) Graduation from an approved school or successful completion of 25 alternate training that meets the criteria established by the 26 secretary; and

27 (((b))) <u>(ii)</u> Good moral character; or

28 (b) A radiologist assistant:

29 (i) Satisfactory completion of a baccalaureate degree, 30 postbaccalaureate certificate, or master's degree encompassing a 31 radiologist assistant curriculum from an approved school of radiologic 32 technology;

33 (ii) Satisfactory completion of a radiologist-directed clinical 34 preceptorship; and

35 (iii) Satisfactory completion of a radiologist assistant 36 examination approved by the secretary. 1 (2) Applicants shall be subject to the grounds for denial or 2 issuance of a conditional license under chapter 18.130 RCW.

3 (3) The secretary shall establish by rule what constitutes adequate
4 proof of meeting the requirements for certification and for designation
5 of certification in a particular field of radiologic technology.

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 18.84 RCW 7 to read as follows:

8 (1) The date and location of radiologist assistant examinations 9 must be established by the secretary. Applicants who have been found 10 by the secretary to meet the other requirements for obtaining a 11 certificate must be scheduled for the next examination following the 12 filing of the application. The secretary shall establish by rule the 13 examination application deadline.

14 (2) The secretary or the secretary's designee shall examine each 15 applicant, by means determined most effective, on subjects appropriate 16 to the scope of practice, as applicable. The examinations must be 17 limited to the purpose of determining whether the applicant possesses 18 the minimum skill and knowledge necessary to practice competently.

19 (3) The examination papers, all grading of the papers, and the 20 grading of any practical work must be preserved for a period of not 21 less than one year after the secretary has made and published the 22 decisions. All examinations must be conducted under fair and wholly 23 impartial methods.

(4) Any applicant failing to make the required grade in the first 24 examination may take up to two subsequent examinations as the applicant 25 26 desires upon prepaying a fee determined by the secretary under RCW Upon failing four 27 43.70.250 for each subsequent examination. examinations, the secretary may invalidate the original application and 28 require remedial education before the person 29 may take future examinations. 30

31 (5) The secretary may approve an examination prepared or 32 administered by a private testing agency or association of 33 credentialing agencies for use by an applicant in meeting the 34 credentialing requirements, including examinations prepared and 35 administered by the American registry of radiologic technologists.

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<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. A new section is added to chapter 18.84 RCW
 to read as follows:

3 It is unprofessional conduct under chapter 18.130 RCW for any 4 person registered or certified under this chapter to interpret images, 5 make diagnoses, prescribe medications or therapies, or perform other 6 procedures that may be prohibited by rule.

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
