- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds:
- 6 (1) The cougar is a beautiful and majestic animal that lives throughout Washington;
 - (2) Many schools in Washington use the cougar as their mascot;
- 9 (3) About two thousand five hundred cougars live in Washington;
- 10 (4) The cougar is the largest cat in Washington; and
- 11 (5) Cougars are important to humans because they control the pest
- 12 populations, such as crickets and rodents, and overpopulated animals
- 13 such as deer.
- 14 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 1.20 RCW
- 15 to read as follows:
- 16 The cougar, Felis concolor, is hereby designated as the official
