AN ACT Relating to strengthening Washington's outer coast marine resources committees; amending RCW 36.125.020; adding a new section to chapter 36.125 RCW; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature finds that Washington's 6 coastal and ocean resources provide vital economic, recreation, 7 transportation, and cultural benefits to the state. The legislature 8 seeks to continue recent state and local efforts to preserve and 9 enhance the state's coastal and ocean resources, such as the work of 10 the Washington ocean policy work group and the state's existing marine 11 resources committees.

The legislature finds that outer coast marine resources committees, 12 13 authorized by the legislature in 2007, provide a mechanism for communities to discuss and develop solutions for the issues facing 14 15 coastal resources and communities. However, additional state 16 investments are necessary to allow outer coast marine resources 17 committees to fulfill their full potential. Therefore, the legislature intends by this act to provide additional support and resources for 18

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outer coast marine resources committees in order to benefit the coastal
 and ocean resources of Washington.

3 **Sec. 2.** RCW 36.125.020 and 2007 c 344 s 3 are each amended to read 4 as follows:

5 (1) A marine resources committee, as described in RCW 36.125.010, 6 may be created by the legislative authority of any county bordering the 7 marine waters of the outer coast or Puget Sound, in cooperation with 8 all appropriate cities and special districts within their boundaries. 9 Adjacent county legislative authorities shall coordinate their efforts 10 whenever there is a mutual interest in creating a marine resources 11 committee.

(2) A county may delegate the management and oversight of a marine resources committee created by the county under RCW 36.125.010 to a city, or cities, within its jurisdiction, if the city or cities are located on the marine waters of the outer coast or southern Puget Sound and are willing to accept the delegation.

17 (3)(a) Participating county legislative authorities must select members of the marine resources committee, ensuring balanced 18 representation from: Local government; local residents; scientific 19 20 experts; affected economic interests; affected recreational interests; 21 and environmental and conservation interests. Additionally, participating county legislative authorities must invite tribal 22 23 representatives to participate in the marine resources committee.

(b) In lieu of creating a new entity, participating county legislative authorities may designate a lead entity created under RCW 77.85.050 to also serve as a marine resources committee. County legislative authorities may only make this designation where the lead entity consents in writing to also serve as a marine resources committee.

30 <u>(c)</u> An initiating county may delegate its appointment authority to 31 a city or cities that have received from the county the delegated 32 responsibilities of managing and overseeing the marine resources 33 committee.

34 (4) County residents may petition the county legislative authority
35 to create a marine resources committee. Upon receipt of a petition,
36 the county legislative authority must respond in writing within sixty

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1 days as to whether they will authorize the creation of a marine 2 resources committee as well as the reasons for their decision.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 36.125 RCW 4 to read as follows:

5 (1) The outer coast marine resources committee program is created 6 to provide support for the development, administration, and 7 coordination of outer coast marine resources committees and their 8 projects.

9 (2) The director of fish and wildlife is the administrator of the 10 outer coast marine resources committee program. As the administrator 11 of the program, the director of fish and wildlife shall:

12 (a) Provide each outer coast marine resources committee with a 13 coordinator to support the administration and work of the committee; 14 and

(b) Distribute grants to outer coast marine resources committees for projects that benefit Washington's coastal marine resources. The director of fish and wildlife shall develop procedures and criteria for allocating funds for projects, which may include annual allocation of funding to each committee.

20 (3) Each outer coast marine resources committee shall prepare and 21 deliver an annual report to the director of fish and wildlife by October 31st of each year. The report must include, but is not limited 22 23 to, a summary of actions taken that year and prioritized 24 recommendations for future action. The director of fish and wildlife shall compile the individual outer coast marine resources committee 25 26 reports into a consolidated report, and provide the consolidated report 27 to the governor and appropriate committees of the legislature by 28 December 31st of each year.

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
