- "NEW SECTION. Sec. 20. (1) A joint select committee on high-5 speed rail is established. The committee shall consider, but is not 6 limited to, developing a plan to build and finance a high-speed rail 7 network running from Bellingham to Portland, Oregon and from Seattle 8 to Spokane. The high-speed rail network must be capable of traveling
- 10 (2) The speaker of the house of representatives and the majority 11 leader of the senate shall select two members from each of the two 12 largest caucuses in the house of representatives and each of the two 13 largest caucuses in the senate to serve on the committee.

9 at speeds of least two hundred twenty-five miles per hour.

- 14 (3) The committee may seek assistance from other members of the 15 senate and the house of representatives and other interested parties 16 to provide advice and technical assistance.
- 17 (4) Staff support for the committee must be provided by the house 18 of representatives office of program research and the senate committee 19 services.
- 20 (5) Legislative members of the committee may be reimbursed for 21 travel expenses in accordance with RCW 44.04.120.

- 10 (b) Identification of potential rights-of-way and routes for new
- 11 construction;
- 12 (c) Identification of public-private financing opportunities
- 13 including:
- 14 (i) Design/build/operate;
- 15 (ii) Sale of development rights;
- 16 (iii) The potential for private ownership of all or portions of a
- 17 new rail system, the operations of a rail system, and operations of
- 18 ancillary services associated with the rail line; and
- 19 (iv) Potential operating costs and public subsidies;
- 20 (d) Examination of opportunities to colocate high-speed rail
- 21 network tracks with a new power grid infrastructure;
- 22 (e) Quantification of economic development potential of
- 23 constructing new rail lines.
- 24 (8) The committee shall report its findings and recommendations to
- 25 the transportation committees of the house of representatives and the
- 26 senate by December 1, 2010.
- 27 (9) This section expires February 1, 2011.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 21. Sections 1 through 5 and 7 through 19 of
- 30 this act take effect December 1, 2011."

EFFECT: (1) Establishes a joint select committee on high-speed rail and associated duties. (2) Specifies that the provisions establishing the joint select committee and prescribing its duties take effect 90 days after adjournment of the session in which the bill is enacted.
