1 On page 1 of the striking amendment, strike all material after 2 line 2 and insert the following:

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4 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The legislature recognizes that land 5 use transportation decisions can significantly affect and the 6 emissions levels of greenhouse gases. Thoughtful and deliberate 7 planning actions that consider the relationship between land use and 8 transportation, while also being mindful of associated impacts upon 9 affordable housing needs, are both challenging and essential. 10 Furthermore, the legislature recognizes that, in addition to 11 responding to present day emissions issues, it must be equally 12 dedicated to enacting broad, prospective strategies. In doing so, the 13 legislature will better enable current Washingtonians and future 14 generations to enjoy the dividends resulting from fewer greenhouse gas 15 emissions, and healthy, economically vibrant communities.

16 (2) In recognition of the importance of reducing greenhouse gas 17 emissions through land use and transportation requirements, and the 18 resulting implementation actions of counties, cities, and others, the 19 legislature intends to establish new land use and transportation 20 provisions, while simultaneously granting certain jurisdictions two 21 additional years to meet existing planning requirements. In granting 22 jurisdictions with the earliest pending review and revision deadlines 23 under the growth management act two additional years to comply with 24 these obligations, the legislature intends to promote the successful 25 implementation of initial efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions 26 through comprehensive planning actions.

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1 (3) The legislature endorses the policy recommendations of the 2 land use and climate change advisory committee established by chapter 3 289, Laws of 2008 for the purpose of reducing land use and 4 transportation related greenhouse gas emissions.

5 (4) The legislature finds that transit-oriented development should 6 be encouraged at major transit stations, and that this development 7 should provide for no net loss of affordable housing, an adequate 8 supply of housing affordable to low and moderate-income households, 9 and the promotion of mixed-use and mixed-income communities and 10 developments.

11 (5) The legislature finds that regional transportation plans for 12 urban counties should address the vehicle miles traveled reduction 13 goals for the state that are established in RCW 47.01.440. The 14 legislature finds also that county and city comprehensive plans should 15 support these regional transportation plans.

16 (6) The legislature finds that regional transit authorities and 17 public transportation benefit areas may donate air rights and surplus 18 property to encourage the development of transit-oriented communities, 19 increase transit ridership, and provide for affordable housing.

20 (7) The legislature finds that transit-oriented housing funds to 21 assist in financing qualifying housing projects should be authorized.

(8) The legislature finds that transit-oriented communities can help achieve these intended purposes and for these reasons they are beneficial to the residents of Washington state."
