- 4 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 18.36A 5 RCW to read as follows:
- 6 (1) A naturopath licensed under this chapter may delegate the 7 application of certain health care modalities to an unlicensed 8 practitioner under the following conditions:
- 9 (a) The supervising naturopath shall ensure that the unlicensed 10 practitioner has sufficient training and competency to deliver the 11 delegated modalities in a manner that is consistent with all current 12 standards for public safety;
- 13 (b) The unlicensed practitioner has liability coverage for the 14 delegated modalities; and
- 15 (c) The unlicensed practitioner has a written emergency protocol 16 to address urgent needs that may occur as a result of the delegated 17 modalities.
- 18 (2) For purposes of this section, "certain health care modalities"
 19 means those therapeutic procedures that do not require direct, one-on20 one contact by the naturopath and may include colon hydrotherapy
 21 performed at a facility other than the supervising naturopath's

- 24 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.36A.050 and 1991 c 3 s 90 are each amended to read 25 as follows:
- Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prohibit or restrict:

- 1 (1) The practice of a profession by individuals who are licensed, 2 certified, or registered under other laws of this state who are 3 performing services within their authorized scope of practice;
- 4 (2) The practice of naturopathic medicine by an individual 5 employed by the government of the United States while the individual 6 is engaged in the performance of duties prescribed for him or her by 7 the laws and regulations of the United States;
- 8 (3) The practice of naturopathic medicine by students enrolled in 9 a school approved by the secretary. The performance of services shall 10 be pursuant to a course of instruction or assignments from an 11 instructor and under the supervision of the instructor. The 12 instructor shall be a naturopath licensed pursuant to this chapter; 13 ((ex))
- 14 (4) The practice of oriental medicine or oriental herbology, or 15 the rendering of other dietary or nutritional advice; or
- 16 <u>(5) The practice of certain health care modalities delegated to</u> 17 <u>unlicensed practitioners under section 1 of this act."</u>

> Strikes all of the provisions in the underlying bill (authorizing the practice of colony hydrotherapy by an unlicensed practitioner under the indirect supervision of a naturopath. Instead, authorizes a naturopath to delegate "certain health care modalities" to an unlicensed practitioner if: (1) the supervising naturopath ensures that the unlicensed practitioner has sufficient training and competency to deliver the modalities in a manner that is consistent with all current standards of public safety, (2) the unlicensed practitioner has liability coverage for the delegated modalities, and (3) the unlicensed practitioner has a written emergency protocol to address urgent needs that may occur as a result of the delegated modalities. "Certain health care modalities" are defined as therapeutic procedures that do not require direct, one-on-one contact by the naturopath and may include colon hydrotherapy performed at a facility other than the supervising physician's office.
