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EFFECT:

- Adds to the Basic Education Goal that a basic education is an evolving program and must provide all students with the opportunity to graduate from high school with a meaningful high school diploma.
- Adds to the Instructional Program of Basic Education the requirement for school districts to provide instruction of sufficient quantity and quality to give students the opportunity to complete graduation requirements intended to prepare them for postsecondary education, gainful employment, and citizenship.
- Requires school districts to provide students the opportunity to complete 24 credits for graduation, with course requirements established by the State Board of Education and subject to a phased-in implementation of the credits as adopted by the Board.
- According to an implementation schedule adopted by the Legislature, increases minimum instructional hours from 1,000 hours averaged across all grades to 1,000 hours for each of grades 1 through 6 and 1,080 hours for each of grades 7 through 12.

• Phases in an increase of all-day kindergarten from 450 hours to 1,000 hours of instruction according to a different statutory implementation schedule.

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
