25 **"Sec. 507.** RCW 28A.185.010 and 1984 c 278 s 12 are each amended 26 to read as follows:

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Pursuant to rules ((and regulations)) adopted by the superintendent of public instruction for the administration of this chapter, the superintendent of public instruction shall carry out a program for highly capable students. Such program may include conducting, coordinating and aiding in research (including pilot programs), disseminating information to local school districts, providing statewide staff development, and allocating to school districts supplementary funds for additional costs of district programs, as provided by RCW ((28A.185.020))28A.150.260.

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11 Sec. 508. RCW 28A.185.020 and 1990 c 33 s 168 are each amended to 12 read as follows:

(1) The legislature finds that, for highly capable students, 14 access to accelerated learning and enhanced instruction is access to a 15 basic education. There are multiple definitions of highly capable, 16 from intellectual to academic to artistic. The research literature 17 strongly supports using multiple criteria to identify highly capable 18 students, and therefore, the legislature does not intend to prescribe 19 a single method. Instead, the legislature intends to allocate funding 20 based on two percent of each school district's population and 21 authorize school districts to identify through the use of multiple, 22 objective criteria those students most highly capable and eligible to 23 receive accelerated learning and enhanced instruction in the program 24 offered by the district. Access to accelerated learning and enhanced 25 instruction through the program for highly capable students does not 26 constitute an individual entitlement for any particular student.

27 (2) Supplementary funds ((as may be)) provided by the state for 28 ((this program, in accordance with RCW 28A.150.370,))the program for 29 highly capable students under RCW 28A.150.260 shall be categorical 30 funding ((on an excess cost basis based upon a per student amount not 31 to exceed three percent of any district's full-time equivalent 32 enrollment))to provide services to highly capable students as 33 determined by a school district under RCW 28A.185.030."

                Includes Highly Capable programs within the definition
      of Basic Education and creates a funding allocation based on 2
      percent of a district's full-time equivalent enrollment to provide
      an extended school day, extended school year, and an allocation
      for maintenance, supplies, and operating costs. Declares
      legislative intent that highly capable students be identified
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using multiple criteria and that school districts should identify those most highly capable to receive accelerated learning and enhanced instruction. States that access to accelerated learning and enhanced instruction through the Highly Capable program is not an individual entitlement.

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
