10 The reappropriations in this section are subject to the following
11 conditions and limitations:

12 (1) The reappropriations are provided solely for the approved list
13 of projects in LEAP capital document No. 2005-14 as developed on April
14 9, 2005.

15 (2) Funds reappropriated for distribution according to RCW
16 79A.15.050 must fulfill the uses and restrictions of each category
17 whether the funds are distributed according to the statutory allotment,
18 the unallocated distribution, or a reassignment of reappropriations.
19 If the cumulative total for acquisition projects is less than the
20 statutory requirement, the difference may be allocated to the remaining
21 development projects.

22 (3) Funds reappropriated for distribution according to the
23 provisions of RCW 79A.15.040(1)(c) must be allocated forty percent to
24 local government projects and sixty percent to state agency projects.
25 If the cumulative total of local government projects is less than forty
26 percent of the total distribution to this category, the difference may
27 be allocated to state agency projects.

6 Renumber the remaining sections consecutively and correct any
7 internal references accordingly.

EFFECT: Reduces state general obligation bond appropriations for the Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program by \$10 million. Appropriates \$10 million in state general obligation bonds for the Forest Riparian Easement Program (FREP) at the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Eliminates proviso language requiring the DNR to develop a prioritization process for purchasing easements eligible under the FREP.

FISCAL IMPACT: No net change to appropriated state bond levels.

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
