Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the following:

3 "Sec. 1. RCW 28A.150.262 and 2005 c 356 s 2 are each amended to 4 read as follows:

Under RCW 28A.150.260, the superintendent of public instruction 5 6 shall revise the definition of a full-time equivalent student to include students who receive instruction through digital programs. 7 8 "Digital programs" means electronically delivered learning that occurs 9 primarily away from the classroom. The superintendent of public 10 instruction has the authority to adopt rules to implement the revised 11 definition beginning with the 2005-2007 biennium for school districts 12 claiming state funding for the programs. The rules shall include but 13 not be limited to the following:

14 (1) Defining a full-time equivalent student under RCW 28A.150.260 or part-time student under RCW 28A.150.350 based upon the district's 15 16 estimated average weekly hours of learning activity as identified in 17 the student's learning plan, as long as the student is found, through monthly evaluation, to be making satisfactory progress; the rules shall 18 19 require districts providing programs under this section to nonresident 20 students to establish procedures that address, at a minimum, the 21 coordination of student counting for state funding so that no student 22 is counted for more than one full-time equivalent in the aggregate;

(2) Requiring the board of directors of a school district offering, or contracting under RCW 28A.150.305 to offer, a digital program to adopt and annually review written policies for each program and program provider and to receive an annual report on its digital learning programs from its staff;

(3) Requiring each school district offering or contracting to offer
a digital program to report annually to the superintendent of public

1 instruction on the types of programs and course offerings, and number 2 of students participating;

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(4) Requiring completion of a program self-evaluation;

4 (5) Requiring documentation of the district of the student's5 physical residence;

6 (6) Requiring that supervision, monitoring, assessment, and 7 evaluation of the digital program be provided by certificated 8 instructional staff;

9 (7) Requiring each school district offering courses or programs to 10 identify the ratio of certificated instructional staff to full-time 11 equivalent students enrolled in such courses or programs, and to 12 include a description of their ratio as part of the reports required 13 under subsections (2) and (3) of this section;

14 (8) Requiring reliable methods to verify a student is doing his or 15 her own work; the methods may include proctored examinations or 16 projects, including the use of web cams or other technologies. 17 "Proctored" means directly monitored by an adult authorized by the 18 school district;

(9) Requiring, for each student receiving instruction in a digital program, a learning plan that includes a description of course objectives and information on the requirements a student must meet to successfully complete the program or courses. The rules shall allow course syllabi and other additional information to be used to meet the requirement for a learning plan;

(10) Requiring that the district assess the educational progress of 25 26 enrolled students at least annually, using, for full-time students, the 27 state assessment for the student's grade level and using any other annual assessments required by the school district. Part-time students 28 29 shall also be assessed at least annually. However, part-time students 30 who are either receiving home-based instruction under chapter 28A.200 RCW or who are enrolled in an approved private school under chapter 31 32 28A.195 RCW are not required to participate in the assessments required under chapter 28A.655 RCW. The rules shall address how students who 33 reside outside the geographic service area of the school district are 34 35 to be assessed;

36 (11) Requiring that each student enrolled in the program have 37 direct personal contact with certificated instructional staff at least 38 weekly until the student completes the course objectives or the requirements in the learning plan. Direct personal contact is for the purposes of instruction, review of assignments, testing, evaluation of student progress, or other learning activities. Direct personal contact may include the use of telephone, e-mail, instant messaging, interactive video communication, or other means of digital communication;

(12) Requiring state-funded public schools or public school 7 8 programs whose primary purpose is to provide digital learning programs to receive accreditation through the ((state accreditation program or 9 10 through the regional accreditation program)) northwest association of 11 accredited schools, or another national, regional, or state accreditation program listed by the office of the superintendent of 12 13 public instruction after consultation with the Washington coalition for 14 online learning;

15 (13) Requiring state-funded public schools or public school 16 programs whose primary purpose is to provide digital learning to 17 provide information to students and parents on whether or not the 18 courses or programs: Cover one or more of the school district's 19 learning goals or of the state's essential academic learning 20 requirements or whether they permit the student to meet one or more of 21 the state's or district's graduation requirements; and

22 (14) Requiring that a school district that provides one or more 23 digital courses to a student provide the parent or guardian of the 24 student, prior to the student's enrollment, with a description of any difference between home-based education as described in chapter 28A.200 25 26 RCW and the enrollment option selected by the student. The parent or 27 guardian shall sign documentation attesting to his or her understanding of the difference and the documentation shall be retained by the 28 29 district and made available for audit.

30 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The office of the superintendent of public instruction shall conduct a review of online courses and programs 31 32 offered to students during the 2008-09 school year to create a baseline of information about part-time, full-time, and interdistrict student 33 34 enrollment; how courses and programs are offered and overseen; contract 35 terms and funding arrangements; the fiscal impact on school district 36 levy bases and levy equalization from interdistrict student enrollment; student-to-teacher ratios; course and program completion and success 37

1 rates; student retention and dropout rates; and how issues such as 2 student assessment, special education, and teacher certification are 3 addressed. The office of the superintendent of public instruction 4 shall submit a report to the education committees of the legislature by 5 December 1, 2009."

6 Correct the title.

<u>EFFECT:</u> Strikes all provisions of the underlying bill and replaces them with:

1. Requires digital programs that are eligible to be claimed for state basic education funding if students are enrolled in them to be accredited by the Northwest Association of Accredited Schools or another national, regional, or state accreditation program listed by SPI after consultation with the Washington Coalition for Online Learning.

2. Directs SPI to conduct a review of online courses and programs offered in 2008-09 to create baseline information about student enrollment; how programs are offered; contract terms and funding; fiscal impact on levy bases and levy equalization from interdistrict enrollment; staffing ratios; course completion and success rates; dropout and retention; and how issues such as assessment, special education, and teacher certification are addressed. Requires a report by December 1, 2009.

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
