- 4 <u>"NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.20
- 5 RCW to read as follows:
- 6 (1) This section provides an alternative process for awarding
- 7 contracts for construction, building, renovation, remodeling,
- 8 alteration, repair, or improvement of university buildings and
- 9 facilities in which critical patient care or highly specialized
- 10 medical research is located. These provisions may be used, in lieu of
- 11 other procedures to award contracts for such work, when the estimated
- 12 cost of the work is equal to or less than five million dollars and the
- 13 project involves construction, removation, remodeling, or alteration
- 14 of improvements within a building that is used directly for critical
- 15 patient care or highly specialized medical research.
- 16 (2) The university may create a single critical patient care or
- 17 specialized medical research facilities roster or may create multiple
- 18 critical patient care or specialized medical research facilities
- 19 rosters for different trade specialties or categories of anticipated
- 20 work. At least once a year, the university shall publish in a
- 21 newspaper of general circulation a notice of the existence of the
- 22 roster or rosters and solicit a statement of qualifications from
- 23 contractors who wish to be on the roster or rosters of prime
- 24 contractors. In addition, qualified contractors shall be added to the
- 25 roster or rosters at any time they submit a written request, necessary
- 26 records, and meet the qualifications established by the university.
- 27 The university may require eligible contractors desiring to be placed

- 1 on a roster to keep current records of any applicable licenses,
- 2 certifications, registrations, bonding, insurance, or other
- 3 appropriate matters on file with the university as a condition of
- 4 being placed on a roster or rosters. Placement on a roster shall be
- 5 on the basis of qualifications.
- 6 (3) The public solicitation of qualifications shall include but 7 not be limited to:
- 8 (a) A description of the types of projects to be completed and
- 9 where possible may include programmatic, performance, and technical
- 10 requirements and specifications;
- 11 (b) The reasons for using the critical patient care and
- 12 specialized medical research roster process;
- 13 (c) A description of the qualifications to be required of a
- 14 contractor, including submission of an accident prevention program;
- 15 (d) A description of the process the university will use to
- 16 evaluate qualifications, including evaluation factors and the relative
- 17 weight of factors;
- 18 (e) The form of the contract to be awarded;
- 19 (f) A description of the administrative process by which the
- 20 required qualifications, evaluation process, and project types may be
- 21 appealed; and
- 22 (g) A description of the administrative process by which decisions
- 23 of the university may be appealed.
- 24 (4) The university shall establish a committee to evaluate the
- 25 contractors submitting qualifications. Evaluation criteria for
- 26 selection of the contractor or contractors to be included on a roster
- 27 shall include, but not be limited to:
- 28 (a) Ability of a contractor's professional personnel;
- 29 (b) A contractor's past performance on similar projects, including
- 30 but not limited to medical facilities, and involving either negotiated
- 31 work or other public works contracts;
- 32 (c) The contractor's ability to meet time and budget requirements;
- 33 (d) The contractor's ability to provide preconstruction services,
- 34 as appropriate;

- 1 (e) The contractor's capacity to successfully complete the 2 project;
- 3 (f) The contractor's approach to executing projects;
- 4 (g) The contractor's approach to safety and the contractor's 5 safety history; and
- 6 (h) The contractor's record of performance, integrity, judgment, 7 and skills.
- 8 (5) Contractors meeting the evaluation committee's criteria for 9 selection must be placed on the applicable roster or rosters.
- 10 (6) When a project is selected for delivery through this roster 11 process, the university must establish a procedure for securing 12 written quotations from all contractors on a roster to assure that a 13 competitive price is established. Invitations for quotations shall 14 include an estimate of the scope and nature of the work to be 15 performed as well as materials and equipment to be furnished. Plans 16 and specifications must be included in the invitation but may not be 17 detailed. Award of a project must be made to the responsible bidder 18 submitting the lowest responsive bid.
- 19 (7) The university shall make an effort to solicit proposals from 20 certified minority or certified woman-owned contractors to the extent 21 permitted by the Washington state civil rights act, RCW 49.60.400.
- 22 (8) Beginning in September 2010 and every other year thereafter, 23 the university shall provide a report to the capital projects advisory 24 review board which must, at a minimum, include a list of rosters used, 25 contracts awarded, and a description of outreach to and participation 26 by women and minority-owned businesses.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 10. A new section is added to chapter 43.131 29 RCW to read as follows:
- The alternative process for awarding contracts established in 31 section 9 of this act terminates June 30, 2015, as provided in section 32 3 of this act.
