1 On page 277, after line 32, insert the following:

2 "Sec. 932. RCW 80.36.430 and 2009 c 564 s 960 are each amended to 3 read as follows:

4 (1) The Washington telephone assistance program shall be funded by 5 a telephone assistance excise tax on all switched access lines and by 6 funds from any federal government or other programs for this purpose. 7 Switched access lines are defined in RCW 82.14B.020. The telephone 8 assistance excise tax shall be applied equally to all residential and 9 business access lines not to exceed fourteen cents per month. The 10 department shall submit an approved annual budget for the Washington 11 telephone assistance program to the department of revenue no later 12 than March 1st prior to the beginning of each fiscal year. The 13 department of revenue shall then determine the amount of telephone 14 assistance excise tax to be placed on each switched access line and local exchange companies 15 shall inform and the utilities and 16 transportation commission of this amount no later than May 1st. The 17 department of revenue shall determine the amount of telephone 18 assistance excise tax by dividing the total of the program budget 19 funded by the telephone assistance excise tax, as submitted by the 20 department, by the total number of switched access lines in the prior 21 calendar year. The telephone assistance excise tax shall be 22 separately identified on each ratepayer's bill as the "Washington 23 telephone assistance program." All money collected from the telephone 24 assistance excise tax shall be transferred to a telephone assistance 25 fund administered by the department.

26 (2) Local exchange companies shall bill the fund for their 27 expenses incurred in offering the telephone assistance program, 1 including administrative and program expenses. The department shall 2 disburse the money to the local exchange companies. The department is 3 exempted from having to conclude a contract with local exchange 4 companies in order to effect this reimbursement. The department shall 5 recover its administrative costs from the fund. The department may 6 specify by rule the range and extent of administrative and program 7 expenses that will be reimbursed to local exchange companies.

8 (3) The department shall enter into an agreement with the 9 \*department of community, trade, and economic development for an 10 amount not to exceed eight percent of the prior fiscal year's total 11 revenue for the administrative and program expenses of providing 12 community service voice mail services. The community service voice 13 mail service may include toll-free lines in community action agencies 14 through which recipients can access their community service voice 15 mailboxes at no charge.

16 (4) During the 2009-2011 biennium, the department shall enter into 17 an agreement with the ((military department)) <u>WIN 211 organization</u> for 18 ((one million dollars to)) <u>operational</u> support ((the WIN 211 19 program))."

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21 Renumber the sections consecutively and correct any internal 22 references accordingly. Correct the title.

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**EFFECT:** Requires the Department of Social and Health Services to contract directly with WIN 211 for services, rather than passing funds through the Military Department.

FISCAL IMPACT: No change to appropriated levels.

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
