Background:

In 2008 legislation was passed dealing with the practice of counseling. The legislation eliminated the credential of registered counselor as of July 1, 2010, and created eight new credentials:

- Agency Affiliated Counselors (authorized to provide counseling services on behalf of a state agency);
- Certified Advisors (authorized to engage in private practice counseling);
- Certified Counselors (authorized to engage in private practice counseling); and
- the following associate and trainee credentials for persons who are working toward achieving educational and/or experiential requirements for full credentialing:
 - Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist Associate;
 - Licensed Mental Health Counselor Associate;
 - Licensed Social Work Associate Advanced:
 - Licensed Social Work Associate Independent Clinical; and
 - Chemical Dependency Professional Trainee.

The 2008 legislation did not, however, update the section of the Uniform Disciplinary Act that lists the professions over which the Secretary of Health has disciplinary authority.

Effective Date: The bill takes effect 90 days after adjournment of the session in which the bill is passed, except section 2, relating to the exclusion of registered counselors, which takes effect July 1, 2010.
