#### Background:

The Washington State Patrol (WSP) is authorized by statute to accept donations, grants, bequests, money, and property for the Fire Service Training Program.

Summary of Bill:

The WSP may accept donations, grants, bequests, money, and property for any purpose in fulfilling its mission.
