Background: "Partisan office" means a public office for which a candidate may indicate a political party preference.

The following elective offices are partisan:

- United States Senate;
- United States House of Representatives;
- state legislative offices; and
- county offices.

The following elective offices are non-partisan:

- the Superintendent of Public Instruction;
- state judicial offices; and
- county judicial offices, as well as any county offices declared non-partisan by homerule charter.

Summary of Bill: The office of county prosecuting attorney is non-partisan. No person may hold both a nonpartisan and partisan elective office at the same time.

Senate Bill Report -1 - SB 5065

Effective Date: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

Staff Summary of Public Testimony: PRO: Justice does not have a partisan preference. The nature of the justice system will always leave one party disappointed, and having a partisan preference presents a reason to assign blame. Not having a partisan preference will help gain the public's trust. The King County executive only has one partisan position: the county prosecuting attorney.
