Background: The laws establishing procedures for the conduct of elections in Title 29 RCW were reorganized and recodified into a new title, Title 29A RCW, in 2004. RCW 29.13.060 was inadvertently repealed during this process. That statute permits school board directors, in a county with a population of 200,000 or more and a first-class school district containing a city of the first class, to be elected for terms of six years. The school districts of Everett, Spokane, and Tacoma each permit its board of directors to serve six-year terms as authorized under the inadvertently repealed statute.

Summary of Bill: The provisions of RCW 29.13.060 are reenacted and recodified within chapter 29A.04 RCW. The act is retroactive and must be applied from July 1, 2004.

Appropriation: None.

Effective Date: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

Staff Summary of Public Testimony: PRO: This bill is a technical correction to fix a small legislative error made a few years ago when the entire election laws were recodified and reorganized. Six-year terms for school board directors are referenced in quite a few statutes and board members continue to be elected based on this repealed statute. Correcting this
