# SENATE BILL REPORT SB 5439

**Background**: Chapter 156 of the Laws of 2007 created a state domestic partnership registry at the Office of the Secretary of State (OSOS), and extended certain property, probate, intestacy, and health care powers and rights to state-registered domestic partners.

The Washington State Patrol Retirement System (WSPRS) pays certain retirement and death benefits to the surviving spouses of its members.

The surviving spouse of a WSPRS member who is killed in the line of duty is eligible to purchase health care benefits from the Public Employees' Benefits Board (PEBB) and receive reimbursement for the cost of participating in the PEBB health insurance plan.

Summary of Bill: The bill as referred to committee not considered.

**Summary of Bill (Proposed Substitute)**: Throughout WSPRS provisions relating to retirement and death benefits, references to "surviving spouse" are amended to include "or state-registered domestic partner;" references to "marriage" are amended to include "or state-registered domestic partnership," and references to "ex spouse" are amended to include "or former state-registered domestic partner."

A WSPRS member's state-registered domestic partner is added to the list of survivors who are eligible to purchase health care benefits from PEBB, and receive reimbursement for the cost of participating in a PEBB health insurance plan.

This analysis was prepared by non-partisan legislative staff for the use of legislative members in their deliberations. This analysis is not a part of the legislation nor does it constitute a statement of legislative intent.

As used throughout the WSPRS provisions, "state-registered domestic partners" is defined as two adults who meet the requirements for a valid state-registered domestic partnership, and who have been issued a certificate by OSOS.
