**Background**: Legislation was enacted in 2004 which required the Department of Health (DOH) to develop an instrument that would allow hospitals to anonymously evaluate surveys and audits conducted by a variety of state agencies. These evaluations can be returned to the department for distribution to the appropriate agency. Results are compiled by the department and submitted to the Legislature.

**Summary of Bill**: The department is no longer required to provide an instrument to evaluate surveys and audits to hospitals. The report to the Legislature is eliminated.

**Appropriation**: None.

**Fiscal Note**: Not requested.

**Effective Date**: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.
