## HOUSE BILL 1116

State of Washington 61st Legislature 2009 Regular Session

By Representatives Blake, Pearson, and Warnick

Read first time 01/14/09. Referred to Committee on Agriculture & Natural Resources.

AN ACT Relating to visible clothing requirements for individuals recreating in a mixed-use area during hunting season; amending RCW 77.15.160 and 77.08.010; adding a new section to chapter 77.15 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 77.12 RCW; and prescribing penalties.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 77.15 RCW 7 to read as follows:

8 (1) An individual recreating on public land where hunting is 9 allowed must wear hiker orange clothing during any department 10 authorized big game hunting season applicable to the land in question.

11 (2) A violation of this section is an infraction punishable under 12 RCW 77.15.160.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 77.12 RCW 14 to read as follows:

(1) All public land where multiple recreational uses are allowed must be posted with signage at all public trailheads during department authorized big game hunting seasons notifying users of the requirements of section 1 of this act. 1 (2) The department shall work with other public landowners or 2 managers to provide uniform signage and hunting season information as 3 necessary to comply with this section.

4 **Sec. 3.** RCW 77.15.160 and 2000 c 107 s 237 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 A person is guilty of an infraction, which shall be cited and 7 punished as provided under chapter 7.84 RCW, if the person:

8 (1) Fails to immediately record a catch of fish or shellfish on a 9 catch record card required by RCW 77.32.430, or required by rule of the 10 commission under this title; ((<del>or</del>))

11 (2) Fishes for personal use using barbed hooks in violation of any 12 rule; ((<del>or</del>))

13 (3) <u>Fails to properly wear hiker orange clothing in violation of</u> 14 <u>section 1 of this act; or</u>

15 <u>(4)</u> Violates any other rule of the commission or director that is 16 designated by rule as an infraction.

17 Sec. 4. RCW 77.08.010 and 2008 c 277 s 2 are each amended to read 18 as follows:

19 The definitions in this section apply throughout this title or 20 rules adopted under this title unless the context clearly requires 21 otherwise.

(1) "Angling gear" means a line attached to a rod and reel capable
of being held in hand while landing the fish or a hand-held line
operated without rod or reel.

(2) "Aquatic invasive species" means any invasive, prohibited,
regulated, unregulated, or unlisted aquatic animal or plant species as
defined under subsections ((48) through (53))) (3), (26), (35), (39),
(52), and (53) of this section, aquatic noxious weeds as defined under
RCW 17.26.020(5)(c), and aquatic nuisance species as defined under RCW
77.60.130(1).

31 (3) "Aquatic plant species" means an emergent, submersed, partially 32 submersed, free-floating, or floating-leaving plant species that grows 33 in or near a body of water or wetland.

34 (4) "Bag limit" means the maximum number of game animals, game35 birds, or game fish which may be taken, caught, killed, or possessed by

a person, as specified by rule of the commission for a particular
 period of time, or as to size, sex, or species.

3 (5) "Closed area" means a place where the hunting of some or all
4 species of wild animals or wild birds is prohibited.

(6) "Closed season" means all times, manners of taking, and places 5 or waters other than those established by rule of the commission as an б 7 open season. "Closed season" also means all hunting, fishing, taking, 8 or possession of game animals, game birds, game fish, food fish, or shellfish that do not conform to the special restrictions or physical 9 10 descriptions established by rule of the commission as an open season or that have not otherwise been deemed legal to hunt, fish, take, harvest, 11 12 or possess by rule of the commission as an open season.

(7) "Closed waters" means all or part of a lake, river, stream, orother body of water, where fishing or harvesting is prohibited.

15 (8) "Commercial" means related to or connected with buying,16 selling, or bartering.

17

(9) "Commission" means the state fish and wildlife commission.

18 (10) "Concurrent waters of the Columbia river" means those waters 19 of the Columbia river that coincide with the Washington-Oregon state 20 boundary.

(11) "Deleterious exotic wildlife" means species of the animal kingdom not native to Washington and designated as dangerous to the environment or wildlife of the state.

(12) "Department" means the department of fish and wildlife.

25

(13) "Director" means the director of fish and wildlife.

(14) "Endangered species" means wildlife designated by thecommission as seriously threatened with extinction.

(15) "Ex officio fish and wildlife officer" means a commissioned 28 29 officer of a municipal, county, state, or federal agency having as its primary function the enforcement of criminal laws in general, while the 30 officer is in the appropriate jurisdiction. The term "ex officio fish 31 32 and wildlife officer" includes special agents of the national marine fisheries service, state parks commissioned officers, United States 33 fish and wildlife special agents, department of natural resources 34 35 enforcement officers, and United States forest service officers, while 36 the agents and officers are within their respective jurisdictions.

(16) "Fish" includes all species classified as game fish or foodfish by statute or rule, as well as all fin fish not currently

classified as food fish or game fish if such species exist in state
 waters. The term "fish" includes all stages of development and the
 bodily parts of fish species.

4 (17) "Fish and wildlife officer" means a person appointed and 5 commissioned by the director, with authority to enforce this title and 6 rules adopted pursuant to this title, and other statutes as prescribed 7 by the legislature. Fish and wildlife officer includes a person 8 commissioned before June 11, 1998, as a wildlife agent or a fisheries 9 patrol officer.

10 (18) "Fishery" means the taking of one or more particular species 11 of fish or shellfish with particular gear in a particular geographical 12 area.

13 (19) "Freshwater" means all waters not defined as saltwater 14 including, but not limited to, rivers upstream of the river mouth, 15 lakes, ponds, and reservoirs.

16 (20) "Fur-bearing animals" means game animals that shall not be 17 trapped except as authorized by the commission.

18 (21) "Game animals" means wild animals that shall not be hunted 19 except as authorized by the commission.

20 (22) "Game birds" means wild birds that shall not be hunted except 21 as authorized by the commission.

(23) "Game farm" means property on which wildlife is held or raised
for commercial purposes, trade, or gift. The term "game farm" does not
include publicly owned facilities.

(24) "Game reserve" means a closed area where hunting for all wildanimals and wild birds is prohibited.

27 (25) <u>"Hiker orange clothing" means a minimum of four hundred square</u> 28 <u>inches of fluorescent orange exterior clothing worn above the waist and</u> 29 <u>visible from all sides.</u>

30 (26) "Invasive species" means a plant species or a nonnative animal 31 species that either:

32 (a) Causes or may cause displacement of, or otherwise threatens,33 native species in their natural communities;

34 (b) Threatens or may threaten natural resources or their use in the 35 state;

36 (c) Causes or may cause economic damage to commercial or 37 recreational activities that are dependent upon state waters; or

38 (d) Threatens or harms human health.

1 (((26))) (27) "License year" means the period of time for which a
2 recreational license is valid. The license year begins April 1st, and
3 ends March 31st.

4 ((<del>(27)</del>)) <u>(28)</u> "Limited-entry license" means a license subject to a 5 license limitation program established in chapter 77.70 RCW.

6 ((<del>(28)</del>)) <u>(29)</u> "Nonresident" means a person who has not fulfilled 7 the qualifications of a resident.

8 ((<del>(29)</del>)) <u>(30)</u> "Offshore waters" means marine waters of the Pacific 9 Ocean outside the territorial boundaries of the state, including the 10 marine waters of other states and countries.

11 ((((30))) (31) "Open season" means those times, manners of taking, 12 and places or waters established by rule of the commission for the 13 lawful hunting, fishing, taking, or possession of game animals, game birds, game fish, food fish, or shellfish that conform to the special 14 restrictions or physical descriptions established by rule of the 15 commission or that have otherwise been deemed legal to hunt, fish, 16 17 take, harvest, or possess by rule of the commission. "Open season" 18 includes the first and last days of the established time.

19 (((31))) (32) "Person" means and includes an individual; a 20 corporation; a public or private entity or organization; a local, 21 state, or federal agency; all business organizations, including 22 corporations and partnerships; or a group of two or more individuals 23 acting with a common purpose whether acting in an individual, 24 representative, or official capacity.

25 (((32))) (33) "Personal use" means for the private use of the 26 individual taking the fish or shellfish and not for sale or barter.

27 (((33))) (34) "Predatory birds" means wild birds that may be hunted 28 throughout the year as authorized by the commission.

29 ((<del>(34)</del>)) <u>(35)</u> "Prohibited aquatic animal species" means an invasive 30 species of the animal kingdom that has been classified as a prohibited 31 aquatic animal species by the commission.

32 (((35))) (36) "Protected wildlife" means wildlife designated by the 33 commission that shall not be hunted or fished.

34 ((<del>(36)</del>)) <u>(37)</u> "Raffle" means an activity in which tickets bearing 35 an individual number are sold for not more than twenty-five dollars 36 each and in which a permit or permits are awarded to hunt or for access 37 to hunt big game animals or wild turkeys on the basis of a drawing from 38 the tickets by the person or persons conducting the raffle.

(((37))) (38) "Recreational and commercial watercraft" includes the 1 2 boat, as well as equipment used to transport the boat, and any auxiliary equipment such as attached or detached outboard motors. 3

4 ((<del>(38)</del>)) <u>(39)</u> "Regulated aquatic animal species" means а potentially invasive species of the animal kingdom that has been 5 classified as a regulated aquatic animal species by the commission. б

((<del>(39)</del>)) (40) "Resident" means:

(a) A person who has maintained a permanent place of abode within 8 the state for at least ninety days immediately preceding an application 9 10 for a license, has established by formal evidence an intent to continue residing within the state, and who is not licensed to hunt or fish as 11 a resident in another state; and 12

13 (b) A person age eighteen or younger who does not qualify as a 14 resident under (a) of this subsection, but who has a parent that qualifies as a resident under (a) of this subsection. 15

((<del>(40)</del>)) (41) "Retail-eligible species" means commercially 16 17 harvested salmon, crab, and sturgeon.

((((41))) (42) "Saltwater" means those marine waters seaward of 18 river mouths. 19

((((42))) (43) "Seaweed" means marine aquatic plant species that are 20 21 dependent upon the marine aquatic or tidal environment, and exist in 22 either an attached or free floating form, and includes but is not 23 limited to marine aquatic plants in the classes Chlorophyta, 24 Phaeophyta, and Rhodophyta.

25

(((43))) (44) "Senior" means a person seventy years old or older.

26 (((44))) (45) "Shellfish" means those species of marine and 27 freshwater invertebrates that have been classified and that shall not be taken except as authorized by rule of the commission. The term 28 29 "shellfish" includes all stages of development and the bodily parts of shellfish species. 30

(((<del>(45)</del>)) <u>(46)</u> "State waters" means all marine waters and fresh 31 32 waters within ordinary high water lines and within the territorial boundaries of the state. 33

((((46))) (47) "To fish," "to harvest," and "to take," and their 34 derivatives means an effort to kill, injure, harass, or catch a fish or 35 36 shellfish.

37 (((47))) (48) "To hunt" and its derivatives means an effort to 38 kill, injure, capture, or harass a wild animal or wild bird.

1 (((48))) (49) "To process" and its derivatives mean preparing or 2 preserving fish, wildlife, or shellfish.

3 ((<del>(49)</del>)) <u>(50)</u> "To trap" and its derivatives means a method of 4 hunting using devices to capture wild animals or wild birds.

5 (((50))) (51) "Trafficking" means offering, attempting to engage,
6 or engaging in sale, barter, or purchase of fish, shellfish, wildlife,
7 or deleterious exotic wildlife.

8 ((<del>(51)</del>)) <u>(52)</u> "Unlisted aquatic animal species" means a nonnative 9 animal species that has not been classified as a prohibited aquatic 10 animal species, a regulated aquatic animal species, or an unregulated 11 aquatic animal species by the commission.

12 ((<del>(52)</del>)) <u>(53)</u> "Unregulated aquatic animal species" means a 13 nonnative animal species that has been classified as an unregulated 14 aquatic animal species by the commission.

15 ((<del>(53)</del>)) <u>(54)</u> "Wild animals" means those species of the class 16 Mammalia whose members exist in Washington in a wild state and the 17 species Rana catesbeiana (bullfrog). The term "wild animal" does not 18 include feral domestic mammals or old world rats and mice of the family 19 Muridae of the order Rodentia.

20 (((-54))) (55) "Wild birds" means those species of the class Aves 21 whose members exist in Washington in a wild state.

22 ((<del>(55)</del>)) <u>(56)</u> "Wildlife" means all species of the animal kingdom 23 whose members exist in Washington in a wild state. This includes but 24 is not limited to mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians, fish, and invertebrates. The term "wildlife" does not include feral domestic 25 26 mammals, old world rats and mice of the family Muridae of the order 27 Rodentia, or those fish, shellfish, and marine invertebrates classified as food fish or shellfish by the director. The term "wildlife" 28 29 includes all stages of development and the bodily parts of wildlife 30 members.

31 (((-56))) (57) "Youth" means a person fifteen years old for fishing 32 and under sixteen years old for hunting.
