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## SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1129

- AN ACT Relating to lifelong learning accounts; adding a new section
- 2 to chapter 28B.50 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 28C.18 RCW; and
- 3 creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. Lifelong learning accounts are portable 6 employee-owned and employer-matched savings accounts dedicated to covering the cost of tuition, fees, books, supplies, and equipment for working adults seeking education and training to improve their position 8 9 in the workforce. The legislature finds that lifelong learning 10 accounts allow employers and workers to coinvest in their futures. legislature further finds that, combined with free career advising, 11 lifelong learning accounts can make a significant difference in the 12 13 lives of workers and their families, as well as for employers in need 14 of well-trained workers. The legislature intends to facilitate the 15 creating of lifelong learning accounts for workers in the state of
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28B.50 RCW
- 18 to read as follows:

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(1) The workforce training and education coordinating board shall establish a state lifelong learning account steering committee. The steering committee shall consist of representatives from the: (a) Association of Washington business; (b) higher education coordinating board; (c) state board for community and technical colleges; (d) department of community, trade, and economic development; (e) Washington state hospital association; (f) Pacific mountain workforce development council; (g) private vocational schools; and (h) state and regional AFL-CIO and SEIU.

- (2) The steering committee shall: (a) Develop a policy framework to establish a statewide lifelong learning account program; (b) identify technical and budget issues along with recommendations on how to resolve them; (c) provide for continuing outreach to workers, employers, and foundations, willing to participate in and fund lifelong learning accounts; and (d) design a performance accountability system.
- (3) The steering committee shall receive staff and logistical support from the workforce training and education coordinating board.
- (4) The steering committee shall report to the appropriate committees of the legislature by September 1, 2010, and every two years thereafter, regarding the numbers and characteristics of participating workers and employers, the status of outreach efforts, and other appropriate performance outcome measures identified by the steering committee.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 28C.18 RCW to read as follows:

The board may receive gifts, grants, or endowments from public or private sources that are made from time to time, in trust or otherwise, for the use and benefit of the board in support of the lifelong learning account program, and may spend gifts, grants, or endowments or income from the public or private sources according to their terms, unless the receipt of the gifts, grants, or endowments violates RCW 42.17.710.

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
