- AN ACT Relating to prohibiting local governments from imposing fees, taxes, or other charges on the transfer of disposable shopping bags; adding a new section to chapter 35.21 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 35A.82 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 36.01 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 82.14 RCW; creating new sections; and declaring an emergency.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 35.21 RCW 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (1) A city or town may not impose a monetary charge on the transfer of disposable paper shopping bags.
- 12 (2) For purposes of this section, "monetary charge" means any 13 governmental charge, regardless of its characterization as a fee, tax, 14 surcharge, or other type of monetary imposition.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 35A.82 RCW to read as follows:
- 17 (1) A code city may not impose a monetary charge on the transfer of disposable paper shopping bags.

- 1 (2) For purposes of this section, "monetary charge" means any 2 governmental charge, regardless of its characterization as a fee, tax, 3 surcharge, or other type of monetary imposition.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 36.01 RCW 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) A county may not impose a monetary charge on the transfer of disposable paper shopping bags.
- 8 (2) For purposes of this section, "monetary charge" means any 9 governmental charge, regardless of its characterization as a fee, tax, 10 surcharge, or other type of monetary imposition.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 82.14 RCW to read as follows:
- Nothing in this chapter authorizes a county or city to impose a tax on the transfer of disposable paper shopping bags.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. The legislature intends this act to be curative, remedial, and retrospectively applicable to January 1, 2008.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. The provisions of this act must be liberally construed to effectuate its intent.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect immediately.
