1 AN ACT Relating to a permit to withdraw public groundwaters; and 2 amending RCW 90.44.050.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 90.44.050 and 2003 c 307 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

After June 6, 1945, no withdrawal of public groundwaters of the б 7 state shall be begun, nor shall any well or other works for such withdrawal be constructed, unless an application to appropriate such 8 9 waters has been made to the department and a permit has been granted by 10 it as herein provided: EXCEPT, HOWEVER, That any withdrawal of public 11 groundwaters for stock-watering purposes, or for the watering of ((a lawn or of)) a noncommercial garden not exceeding one-half acre in 12 13 area, or for single or group domestic uses in an amount not exceeding five thousand gallons a day, or as provided in RCW 90.44.052, or for an 14 15 industrial purpose in an amount not exceeding five thousand gallons a 16 day, is and shall be exempt from the provisions of this section, but, to the extent that it is regularly used beneficially, shall be entitled 17 to a right equal to that established by a permit issued under the 18 provisions of this chapter: PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That the department 19

from time to time may require the person or agency making any such 1 2 small withdrawal to furnish information as to the means for and the quantity of that withdrawal: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That at the option of 3 the party making withdrawals of groundwaters of the state not exceeding 4 five thousand gallons per day, applications under this section or 5 declarations under RCW 90.44.090 may be filed and permits and 6 certificates obtained in the same manner 7 and under the same requirements as is in this chapter provided in the case of withdrawals 8 9 in excess of five thousand gallons a day.
