AN ACT Relating to creating a new credentialing standard for registered retired counselors; amending RCW 18.19.020, 18.19.060, 18.19.090, and 18.130.040; and adding a new section to chapter 18.19 RCW.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.19.020 and 2008 c 135 s 1 are each amended to read 7 as follows:

8 The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter 9 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

10 (1) "Agency" means an agency or facility operated, licensed, or 11 certified by the state of Washington.

12 (2) "Agency affiliated counselor" means a person registered under13 this chapter who is engaged in counseling and employed by an agency.

(3) "Certified adviser" means a person certified under this chapter
who is engaged in private practice counseling to the extent authorized
in RCW 18.19.200.

17 (4) "Certified counselor" means a person certified under this 18 chapter who is engaged in private practice counseling to the extent 19 authorized in RCW 18.19.200. (5) "Client" means an individual who receives or participates in
 counseling or group counseling.

(6) "Counseling" means employing any therapeutic techniques, 3 including but not limited to social work, mental health counseling, 4 marriage and family therapy, and hypnotherapy, for a fee that offer, 5 6 assist or attempt to assist an individual or individuals in the 7 amelioration or adjustment of mental, emotional, or behavioral 8 problems, and includes therapeutic techniques to achieve sensitivity and awareness of self and others and the development of human 9 potential. For the purposes of this chapter, nothing may be construed 10 to imply that the practice of hypnotherapy is necessarily limited to 11 12 counseling.

13 (7) "Counselor" means an individual, practitioner, therapist, or 14 analyst who engages in the practice of counseling to the public for a 15 fee, including for the purposes of this chapter, hypnotherapists.

(8) "Department" means the department of health.

(9) "Hypnotherapist" means a person registered under this chapterwho is practicing hypnosis as a modality.

(10) "Private practice counseling" means the practice of counseling by a certified counselor or certified adviser as specified in RCW 18.19.200.

(11) "Psychotherapy" means the practice of counseling using diagnosis of mental disorders according to the fourth edition of the diagnostic and statistical manual of mental disorders, published in 1994, and the development of treatment plans for counseling based on diagnosis of mental disorders in accordance with established practice standards.

28 (12) <u>"Retired counselor" means a person registered under this</u>
29 <u>chapter who:</u>

30 (a) Has at least twenty years of experience as a registered 31 counselor as the credential existed prior to July 1, 2010, a certified 32 counselor, a certified adviser, or an agency affiliated counselor;

(b) Practices counseling for no compensation; and

34 (c) Needs to register in order to provide volunteer counseling for 35 an organization that requires its volunteer counselors to be 36 credentialed.

37 <u>(13)</u> "Secretary" means the secretary of the department or the 38 secretary's designee.

1 Sec. 2. RCW 18.19.060 and 2008 c 135 s 7 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

3 Certified counselors ((and)), certified advisers, and retired 4 counselors shall provide clients at the commencement of any program of treatment with accurate disclosure information concerning their 5 practice, in accordance with guidelines developed by the department, 6 7 that will inform clients of the purposes of and resources available 8 under this chapter, including the right of clients to refuse treatment, 9 the responsibility of clients for choosing the provider and treatment 10 modality which best suits their needs, and the extent of confidentiality provided by this chapter, the department, another 11 12 agency, or other jurisdiction. For a certified counselor or certified 13 adviser, the disclosure statement must inform the client of the certified counselor's or certified adviser's consultation arrangement 14 or supervisory agreement as defined in rules adopted by the secretary. 15 The disclosure information provided by the certified counselor ((or)), 16 17 certified adviser, or retired counselor, the receipt of which shall be acknowledged in writing by the certified counselor ((or)), certified 18 19 adviser, or retired counselor and the client, shall include any relevant education and training, the therapeutic orientation of the 20 21 practice, the proposed course of treatment where known, any financial 22 requirements, referral resources, and such other information as the 23 department may require by rule. The disclosure information shall also 24 include a statement that the certification of an individual under this chapter does not include a recognition of any practice standards, nor 25 26 necessarily imply the effectiveness of any treatment. Certified 27 counselors ((and)), certified advisers, and retired counselors must 28 also disclose that they are not credentialed to diagnose mental 29 disorders or to conduct psychotherapy as defined by the secretary by 30 rule. The client is not liable for any fees or charges for services rendered prior to receipt of the disclosure statement. 31

32 **Sec. 3.** RCW 18.19.090 and 2008 c 135 s 8 are each amended to read 33 as follows:

(1) Application for agency affiliated counselor, certified
 counselor, certified adviser, <u>retired counselor</u>, or hypnotherapist must
 be made on forms approved by the secretary. The secretary may require
 information necessary to determine whether applicants meet the

qualifications for the credential and whether there are any grounds for 1 denial of the credential, or for issuance of a conditional credential, 2 under this chapter or chapter 18.130 RCW. The application for agency 3 4 affiliated counselor, certified counselor, ((or)) certified adviser, or retired counselor must include a description of the applicant's 5 orientation, discipline, theory, or technique. Each applicant shall б 7 pay a fee determined by the secretary as provided in RCW 43.70.250, 8 which shall accompany the application.

9 (2) Applicants for agency affiliated counselor must provide 10 satisfactory documentation that they are employed by an agency or have 11 an offer of employment from an agency.

12 (3) At the time of application for initial certification, 13 applicants for certified counselor prior to July 1, 2010, are required 14 to:

(a) Have been registered for no less than five years at the time ofapplication for an initial certification;

(b) Have held a valid, active registration that is in good standing and be in compliance with any disciplinary process and orders at the time of application for an initial certification;

20 (c) Show evidence of having completed course work in risk 21 assessment, ethics, appropriate screening and referral, and Washington 22 state law and other subjects identified by the secretary;

(d) Pass an examination in risk assessment, ethics, appropriate screening and referral, and Washington state law, and other subjects as determined by the secretary; and

(e) Have a written consultation agreement with a credential holderwho meets the qualifications established by the secretary.

(4) Unless eligible for certification under subsection (3) of this
 section, applicants for certified counselor or certified adviser are
 required to:

31 (a)(i) Have a bachelor's degree in a counseling-related field, if 32 applying for certified counselor; or

33 (ii) Have an associate degree in a counseling-related field and a 34 supervised internship, if applying for certified adviser;

35 (b) Pass an examination in risk assessment, ethics, appropriate 36 screening and referral, and Washington state law, and other subjects as 37 determined by the secretary; and

(c) Have a written supervisory agreement with a supervisor who
 meets the qualifications established by the secretary.

3 (5) <u>The secretary shall issue a registration to any retired</u>
4 <u>counselor who meets the requirements of subsection (1) of this section.</u>
5 <u>(6)</u> Each applicant shall include payment of the fee determined by
6 the secretary as provided in RCW 43.70.250.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 18.19 RCW 8 to read as follows:

9 (1) Registration as a retired counselor is optional for a person 10 who practices counseling for no compensation. A person otherwise 11 exempt from this chapter under RCW 18.19.040(3) because he or she 12 practices counseling for no compensation shall not be required to 13 register as a retired counselor.

14 (2) A registered retired counselor shall notify the department if 15 he or she practices, or plans to practice, counseling for compensation. 16 A registered retired counselor may not practice counseling for 17 compensation unless he or she is a certified counselor, certified 18 adviser, or an agency affiliated counselor.

19 Sec. 5. RCW 18.130.040 and 2009 c 2 s 16 (Initiative Measure No. 20 1029) are each amended to read as follows:

(1) This chapter applies only to the secretary and the boards and commissions having jurisdiction in relation to the professions licensed under the chapters specified in this section. This chapter does not apply to any business or profession not licensed under the chapters specified in this section.

26 (2)(a) The secretary has authority under this chapter in relation 27 to the following professions:

(i) Dispensing opticians licensed and designated apprentices underchapter 18.34 RCW;

15 (x) The board of physical therapy as established in chapter 18.74 16 RCW;

17 (xi) The board of occupational therapy practice as established in18 chapter 18.59 RCW;

19 (xii) The nursing care quality assurance commission as established 20 in chapter 18.79 RCW governing licenses and registrations issued under 21 that chapter;

(xiii) The examining board of psychology and its disciplinary
 committee as established in chapter 18.83 RCW; and

24 (xiv) The veterinary board of governors as established in chapter25 18.92 RCW.

(3) In addition to the authority to discipline license holders, the
disciplining authority has the authority to grant or deny licenses.
The disciplining authority may also grant a license subject to
conditions.

(4) All disciplining authorities shall adopt procedures to ensure
 substantially consistent application of this chapter, the Uniform
 Disciplinary Act, among the disciplining authorities listed in
 subsection (2) of this section.
