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## SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1429

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- AN ACT Relating to respite care for primary care providers of persons with developmental disabilities; amending RCW 71A.12.161; and
- 3 adding a new section to chapter 71A.12 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 Sec. 1. RCW 71A.12.161 and 2007 c 283 s 2 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
  - (1) The individual and family services program for individuals eligible to receive services under this title is established. This program replaces family support opportunities, traditional family support, and the flexible family support pilot program. The department shall transfer funding associated with these existing family support programs to the individual and family services program and shall operate the program within available funding. The services provided under the individual and family services program shall be funded by state funding without benefit of federal match.
- 16 (2) The department shall adopt rules to implement this section. 17 The rules shall provide:
- 18 (a) That eligibility to receive services in the individual and

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- 1 family services program be determined solely by an assessment of individual need;
- 3 (b) For service priority levels to be developed that specify a 4 maximum amount of dollars for each person per level per year;
- 5 (c) That the dollar caps for each service priority level be 6 adjusted by the vendor rate increases authorized by the legislature; 7 and
  - (d) That the following services be available under the program:
  - (i) Respite care;
- 10 (ii) Therapies;

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- 11 (iii) Architectural and vehicular modifications;
- 12 (iv) Equipment and supplies;
- 13 (v) Specialized nutrition and clothing;
- 14 (vi) Excess medical costs not covered by another source;
- 15 (vii) Copays for medical and therapeutic services;
- 16 (viii) Transportation;
- 17 (ix) Training;
- 18 (x) Counseling;
- 19 (xi) Behavior management;
- 20 (xii) Parent/sibling education;
- 21 (xiii) Recreational opportunities; and
- 22 (xiv) Community services grants.
- 23 (3) In addition to services provided for the service priority 24 levels under subsections (1) and (2) of this section, the department 25 shall provide for:
  - (a) One-time exceptional needs and emergency needs for individuals and families not receiving individual and family services annual grants to assist individuals and families who experience a short-term crisis; and
  - (b) Respite services based on the department's assessment for a ((parent)) family member who resides with and is the primary caregiver, sibling, grandparent, or other primary care provider who provides personal care in the home to ((his or her)) an adult ((son or daughter)) with developmental disabilities.
- 35 (4) If a person has more complex needs, a family is experiencing a 36 more prolonged crisis, or it is determined a person needs additional 37 services, the department shall assess the individual to determine if 38 placement in a waiver program would be appropriate.

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NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 71A.12 RCW to read as follows:

For adults with developmental disabilities who are on the basic, basic plus, or core waivers and assessed as needing respite services, the department shall provide for respite services for a family member who resides with the adult, is the primary caregiver, and provides personal care to the adult in the home.

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
