1 AN ACT Relating to the legislative youth advisory council; amending 2 RCW 28A.300.801; and declaring an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 28A.300.801 and 2007 c 291 s 2 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

The legislative youth advisory council is established to 6 (1)7 examine issues of importance to youth, including but not limited to education, employment, strategies to increase youth participation in 8 9 state and municipal government, safe environments for youth, substance 10 abuse, emotional and physical health, foster care, poverty, 11 homelessness, and youth access to services on a statewide and municipal 12 basis.

(2) The council consists of twenty-two members as provided in this
 subsection who, at the time of appointment, are aged fourteen to
 eighteen. The council shall select a chair from among its members.

16 (3) Except for initial members, members shall serve two-year terms,
17 and if eligible, may be reappointed for subsequent two-year terms.
18 One-half of the initial members shall be appointed to one-year terms,

and these appointments shall be made in such a way as to preserve
 overall representation on the committee.

(4)(a) By July 2, 2007, and annually thereafter, students may apply 3 4 to be considered for participation in the program by completing an online application form and submitting the application to the 5 legislative youth advisory council. The council may develop selection б criteria and an application review process. 7 The council shall 8 recommend candidates whose names will be submitted to the office of the lieutenant governor for final selection. The office of the lieutenant 9 governor shall notify all applicants of the final selections. 10

11 (b) The office of the lieutenant governor shall make the 12 application available on the lieutenant governor's web site.

(5) The council shall have the following duties:

(a) Advising the legislature on proposed and pending legislation,
 including state budget expenditures and policy matters relating to
 youth;

(b) Advising the standing committees of the legislature and study commissions, committees, and task forces regarding issues relating to youth;

20 (c) Conducting periodic seminars for its members regarding 21 leadership, government, and the legislature;

(d) Accepting <u>and soliciting for</u> grants and donations from public
 and private sources to support the activities of the council; and

(e) Reporting annually by December 1st to the legislature on its
 activities, including proposed legislation that implements
 recommendations of the council.

27 (6) In carrying out its duties under this section, the council may meet at least three times but not more than six times per year. 28 The 29 council shall consider conducting at least some of the meetings via the 30 K-20 telecommunications network. ((Councils are)) The council is encouraged to invite local state legislators to participate in the 31 32 meetings. The council is encouraged to poll other students in order to get a broad perspective on the various issues. The council is 33 encouraged to use technology to conduct the polling, including the 34 35 council's web site, if the council has a web site.

36 (7) Members shall be reimbursed as provided in RCW 43.03.050 and 37 43.03.060.

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(8) The office of superintendent of public instruction shall 1 2 provide administration, coordination, and facilitation assistance to The senate and house of representatives may provide 3 the council. policy and fiscal briefings and assistance with drafting proposed 4 legislation. The senate and the house of representatives shall each 5 develop internal policies relating to staff assistance provided to the 6 7 council. Such policies may include applicable internal personnel and 8 guidelines, resource use reimbursement practices and expense guidelines, and applicable ethics mandates. Provision of funds, 9 resources, and staff, as well as the assignment and direction of staff, 10 11 remains at all times within the sole discretion of the chamber making 12 the provision.

13 (9) The office of the lieutenant governor, the office of (([the])) the superintendent of public instruction, the legislature, any agency 14 15 of the legislature, and any official or employee of such office or agency are immune from liability for any injury that is incurred by or 16 caused by a member of the youth advisory council and that occurs while 17 18 the member of the council is performing duties of the council or is 19 otherwise engaged in activities or receiving services for which 20 reimbursement is allowed under subsection (7) of this section. The 21 immunity provided by this subsection does not apply to an injury 22 intentionally caused by the act or omission of an employee or official 23 of the superintendent of public instruction or the legislature or any 24 agency of the legislature.

25 (((10) This section expires June 30, 2009.))

26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate 27 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 28 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 29 immediately.

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
