State of Washington 61st Legislature 2009 Regular Session

By Representatives Orwall, Sullivan, Quall, Priest, and Maxwell; by request of Governor Gregoire

Read first time 02/05/09. Referred to Committee on Education.

1 AN ACT Relating to the professional educator standards board 2 membership and duties; amending RCW 28A.410.200, 28A.410.100, and 3 28A.410.210; adding a new section to chapter 28A.410 RCW; and providing 4 an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 28A.410 7 RCW to read as follows:

8 The professional educator standards board shall:

9 (1) Develop and maintain a research base of educator preparation 10 best practices;

11 (2) Develop and coordinate initiatives for educator preparation in 12 high-demand fields;

(3) Provide program improvement technical assistance to providersof educator preparation programs;

15 (4) Assure educator preparation program compliance; and

16 (5) Prepare and maintain a cohesive educator development policy 17 framework. 1 Sec. 2. RCW 28A.410.200 and 2005 c 497 s 202 are each amended to
2 read as follows:

3 (1)(a) The Washington professional educator standards board is 4 created, consisting of ((twenty)) twelve members to be appointed by the 5 governor to four-year terms and the superintendent of public 6 instruction. <u>On August 1, 2009, the board shall be reduced to twelve</u> 7 members by ending the terms of the appointed members with the least 8 amount of time remaining in their terms.

9 (b) ((As the four-year terms of the first appointees expire or)) 10 Vacancies ((to)) on the board ((occur for the first time,)) shall be filled by appointment or reappointment by the governor ((shall appoint 11 12 or reappoint the members of the board to one-year to four-year 13 staggered terms. Once the one-year to three-year terms expire, all subsequent terms shall be for)) to terms of four years((, with the 14 15 terms expiring on June 30th of the applicable year. The terms shall be staggered in such a way that, where possible, the terms of members 16 17 representing a specific group do not expire simultaneously)).

18 (c) No person may serve as a member of the board for more than two 19 consecutive full four-year terms.

(d) The governor shall ((annually)) biennially appoint the chair of the board ((from among the teachers and principals on the board)). No board member may serve as chair for more than ((two)) four consecutive years.

(2) ((Seven of the members shall be public school teachers, one shall be a private school teacher, three shall represent higher education educator preparation programs, four shall be school administrators, two shall be educational staff associates, one shall be a classified employee who assists in public school student instruction, one shall be a parent, and one shall be a member of the public.

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(3) Public school teachers appointed to the board must:

31 (a) Have at least three years of teaching experience in a
32 Washington public school;

33 (b) Be currently certificated and actively employed in a teaching 34 position; and

35 (c) Include one teacher currently teaching at the elementary school 36 level, one at the middle school level, one at the high school level, 37 and one vocationally certificated.

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(4) Private school teachers appointed to the board must:

- (a) Have at least three years of teaching experience in a
 Washington approved private school; and
- 3 (b) Be currently certificated and actively employed in a teaching
 4 position in an approved private school.

5 (5) Appointees from higher education educator preparation programs 6 must include two representatives from institutions of higher education 7 as defined in RCW 28B.10.016 and one representative from an institution 8 of higher education as defined in RCW 28B.07.020(4).

(6) School administrators appointed to the board must:

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10 (a) Have at least three years of administrative experience in a 11 Washington public school district;

12 (b) Be currently certificated and actively employed in a school 13 administrator position; and

14 (c) Include two public school principals, one Washington approved 15 private school principal, and one superintendent.

16 (7) Educational staff associates appointed to the board must:

17 (a) Have at least three years of educational staff associate
18 experience in a Washington public school district; and

- 19 (b) Be currently certificated and actively employed in an 20 educational staff associate position.
- 21 (8) Public school classified employees appointed to the board must:

22 (a) Have at least three years of experience in assisting in the 23 instruction of students in a Washington public school; and

24 (b) Be currently employed in a position that requires the employee
25 to assist in the instruction of students.

26 (9) Each major caucus of the house of representatives and the 27 senate shall submit a list of at least one public school teacher. In making the public school teacher appointments, the governor shall 28 select one nominee from each list provided by each caucus. The 29 governor shall appoint the remaining members of the board from a list 30 31 of qualified nominees submitted to the governor by organizations representative of the constituencies of the board, from applications 32 from other qualified individuals, or from both nominees and applicants. 33 34 (10) All appointments to the board made by the governor shall be 35 subject to confirmation by the senate.

36 (11) The governor shall appoint the members of the initial board no
37 later than June 1, 2000.

(12) In appointing board members, the governor shall consider the
 diversity of the population of the state.

3 (13)) <u>A majority of the members of the board shall have classroom</u>
4 <u>experience. Membership on the board shall include individuals having</u>
5 <u>one or more of the following:</u>

6 (a) Experience in one or more of the education roles for which
 7 state preparation program approval is required and certificates issued;
 8 (b) Experience providing a state-approved preparation program;

9 <u>(c) Experience providing mentoring and coaching to education</u> 10 professionals or others; and

11 (d) Education-related community experience.

12 (3) In appointing board members, the governor shall consider the 13 individual's commitment to quality education and the ongoing 14 improvement of instruction, experiences in the public schools, 15 involvement in developing quality teaching preparation and support 16 programs, and vision for the most effective yet practical system of 17 assuring teaching quality. The governor shall also consider the 18 diversity of the population of the state.

19 (4) Each member of the board shall be compensated in accordance 20 with RCW 43.03.240 and shall be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred 21 in carrying out the duties of the board in accordance with RCW 22 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

23 (((14))) (5) The governor may remove a member of the board for 24 neglect of duty, misconduct, malfeasance or misfeasance in office, or for incompetency or unprofessional conduct as defined in chapter 18.130 25 26 In such a case, the governor shall file with the secretary of RCW. 27 state a statement of the causes for and the order of removal from office, and the secretary of state shall send a certified copy of the 28 statement of causes and order of removal to the last known post office 29 30 address of the member.

(((15) If a vacancy occurs on the board, the governor shall appoint a replacement member from the nominees as specified in subsection (9) of this section to fill the remainder of the unexpired term. When filling a vacancy of a member nominated by a major caucus of the legislature, the governor shall select the new member from a list of at least one name submitted by the same caucus that provided the list from which the retiring member was appointed. 1 (16)) (6) Members of the board shall hire an executive director
2 and an administrative assistant to reside in the office of the
3 superintendent of public instruction for administrative purposes only.
4 (7) Members of the board may create informal advisory groups as

5 <u>needed to inform the board's work.</u>

6 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28A.410.100 and 2005 c 497 s 207 are each amended to 7 read as follows:

8 Any teacher whose certificate to teach has been questioned under 9 RCW 28A.410.090 shall have a right to be heard by the issuing authority 10 before his or her certificate is revoked. ((Any teacher whose 11 certificate to teach has been revoked shall have a right of appeal to 12 the Washington professional educator standards board if notice of 13 appeal is given by written affidavit to the board within thirty days 14 after the certificate is revoked.

An appeal to the Washington professional educator standards board within the time specified shall operate as a stay of revocation proceedings until the next regular or special meeting of said board and until the board's decision has been rendered.))

19 Sec. 4. RCW 28A.410.210 and 2008 c 176 s 1 are each amended to 20 read as follows:

The purpose of the professional educator standards board is to 21 22 establish policies and requirements for the preparation and 23 certification of educators that provide standards for competency in 24 professional knowledge and practice in the areas of certification; a 25 foundation of skills, knowledge, and attitudes necessary to help students with diverse needs, abilities, cultural experiences, and 26 learning styles meet or exceed the learning goals outlined in RCW 27 28A.150.210; knowledge of research-based practice; and professional 28 29 development throughout a career. The Washington professional educator standards board shall: 30

31 (1) Establish policies and practices for the approval of programs 32 of courses, requirements, and other activities leading to educator 33 certification including teacher, school administrator, and educational 34 staff associate certification;

35 (2) Establish policies and practices for the approval of the36 character of work required to be performed as a condition of entrance

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1 to and graduation from any educator preparation program including 2 teacher, school administrator, and educational staff associate 3 preparation program as provided in subsection (1) of this section;

4 (3) Establish a list of accredited institutions of higher education 5 of this and other states whose graduates may be awarded educator 6 certificates as teacher, school administrator, and educational staff 7 associate and establish criteria and enter into agreements with other 8 states to acquire reciprocal approval of educator preparation programs 9 and certification, including teacher certification from the national 10 board for professional teaching standards;

11 (4) Establish policies for approval of nontraditional educator 12 preparation programs;

(5) Conduct a review of educator program approval standards at least every five years, beginning in 2006, to reflect research findings and assure continued improvement of preparation programs for teachers, administrators, and school specialized personnel;

17 (6) Specify the types and kinds of educator certificates to be 18 issued and conditions for certification in accordance with subsection 19 (1) of this section and RCW 28A.410.010;

20 (7) ((Hear and determine educator certification appeals as provided 21 by RCW 28A.410.100;

(8)) Apply for and receive federal or other funds on behalf of the
 state for purposes related to the duties of the board;

24 (((9))) <u>(8)</u> Adopt rules under chapter 34.05 RCW that are necessary 25 for the effective and efficient implementation of this chapter;

26 (((10))) <u>(9)</u> Maintain data concerning educator preparation programs 27 and their quality, educator certification, educator employment trends 28 and needs, and other data deemed relevant by the board;

29 (((11))) <u>(10)</u> Serve as an advisory body to the superintendent of 30 public instruction on issues related to educator recruitment, hiring, 31 mentoring and support, professional growth, retention, educator 32 evaluation including but not limited to peer evaluation, and revocation 33 and suspension of licensure;

34 (((12))) <u>(11)</u> Submit, by October 15th of each even-numbered year, 35 a joint report with the state board of education to the legislative 36 education committees, the governor, and the superintendent of public 37 instruction. The report shall address the progress the boards have

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1 made and the obstacles they have encountered, individually and 2 collectively, in the work of achieving the goals set out in RCW 3 28A.150.210;

4 (((13))) (12) Establish the prospective teacher assessment system
5 for basic skills and subject knowledge that shall be required to obtain
6 residency certification pursuant to RCW 28A.410.220 through
7 28A.410.240;

8 (((14))) <u>(13)</u> By January 2010, set performance standards and 9 develop, pilot, and implement a uniform and externally administered 10 professional-level certification assessment based on demonstrated 11 teaching skill. In the development of this assessment, consideration 12 shall be given to changes in professional certification program 13 components such as the culminating seminar; and

14 ((((15)))) (14) Conduct meetings under the provisions of chapter 15 42.30 RCW.
