- AN ACT Relating to safe and healthful food; and adding a new
- 2 section to chapter 70.54 RCW.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 70.54 RCW 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) The commission on safe and healthful food is established 7 composed of sixteen members as follows:
 - (a) Nine members appointed by the governor as follows:
- 9 (i) Two members representing food producers;
- 10 (ii) Two members representing food processors;
- 11 (iii) Two members representing product retailers;
- 12 (iv) Two members representing consumers; and
- 13 (v) One member to serve as chairperson;
- 14 (b) Two members representing the house of representatives,
- 15 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, with one
- 16 representative chosen from each of the two largest caucuses of the
- 17 house of representatives;

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18 (c) Two members representing the senate, appointed by the president

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- of the senate, with one representative chosen from each of the two largest caucuses of the senate;
- 3 (d) The director of the department of agriculture, or the 4 director's designee;
- 5 (e) The director of the department of health, or the director's designee; and
 - (f) One member representing local health districts.
- 8 (2) Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner that the original appointments were made.
- 10 (3) A majority of the members of the commission shall constitute a 11 quorum for the transaction of business.
- 12 (4) Members of the commission shall be reimbursed for travel 13 expenses as provided in RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.
 - (5) The commission must:

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- 15 (a) Identify current issues relating to foodborne illness outbreaks 16 and the ways state oversight and regulation may help prevent and 17 mitigate the effects of the outbreaks;
- 18 (b) Identify best practices for notifying consumers of food product 19 recalls;
 - (c) Identify state and federal efforts to enforce labeling and inspection laws and determine if additional resources are necessary;
- 22 (d) Recommend and prioritize actions that may be taken by the state 23 to provide disclosure to consumers on food products for the following:
 - (i) Irradiated foods;
 - (ii) Genetically engineered food;
 - (iii) Modified atmosphere packaging;
- 27 (iv) Organic labeling;
- 28 (v) Needling meat; and
 - (vi) Location of packaging and date packaged; and
- 30 (e) Serve as a forum for discussion and resolution of issues on 31 healthy food and safe food.
- 32 (6) Recommendations based on the priorities established by the 33 commission must be reported to appropriate committees of the 34 legislature by December 1st of each year.

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
