- 1 AN ACT Relating to forensic investigations; amending RCW
- 2 43.103.040; and adding a new section to chapter 43.103 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.103 RCW to read as follows:
- 6 (1) The council shall develop minimum standards for facilities used 7 to perform autopsies in order to ensure that such facilities are 8 designed and equipped in a manner that promotes accurate and efficient 9 autopsies. The minimum standards shall include, but not be limited to, 10 standards in the following areas:
- 11 (a) Equipment;
- 12 (b) Sanitation;
- 13 (c) Lighting; and
- 14 (d) Ventilation and other environmental systems.
- 15 (2) The council shall also:
- 16 (a) Develop a written methodology for determining whether a
- 17 facility is in compliance with the minimum standards; and
- 18 (b) Make recommendations regarding:

1 (i) An inspection mechanism that could be used by a certifying body 2 to determine whether a facility is in compliance with the minimum 3 standards; and

- (ii) Other methods through which the minimum standards could be implemented on a statewide basis.
- (3) The council shall report the minimum standards, the methodology, and recommendations to the governor and the appropriate committees of the legislature no later than December 1, 2011.

## 9 **Sec. 2.** RCW 43.103.040 and 1995 c 398 s 5 are each amended to read 10 as follows:

The council shall consist of ((twelve)) thirteen members who shall be selected as follows: One county coroner; one county prosecutor; one county prosecutor who also serves as ex officio county coroner; one county medical examiner from a county with a population of over six hundred thousand; one county medical examiner from a county with a population of under five hundred thousand; one county sheriff; one chief of police; the chief of the state patrol; two members of a county legislative authority; one pathologist who is currently in private practice; and two members of a city legislative authority.

The governor shall appoint members to the council from among the nominees submitted for each position as follows: The Washington association of county officials shall submit two nominees each for the coroner position and the medical examiner positions; the Washington state association of counties shall submit two nominees each for the two county legislative authority positions; the association Washington cities shall submit two nominees each for the two city legislative authority positions; the Washington association prosecuting attorneys shall submit two nominees each for the county prosecutor-ex officio county coroner and for the county prosecutor position; the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs shall submit two nominees each for the county sheriff position and the chief position; police and the Washington association pathologists shall submit two nominees for the private pathologist position.
