1 AN ACT Relating to creating a bi-state partnership for teachers of 2 children with visual impairments; adding a new section to chapter 3 28B.30 RCW; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that Washington needs to provide additional resources for the preparation of teachers for б 7 children with blindness and visual impairments. The legislature further finds that Portland State University has a nationally 8 9 recognized program for teachers of children with visual impairments and 10 that a collaborative partnership between Portland State University and 11 Washington State University-Vancouver would help address the critical need for teachers of the blind and visually impaired in Washington. 12 The legislature intends to provide a vision impairments/orientation and 13 14 mobility coordinator to be housed at Washington State University-15 Vancouver.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28B.30 RCW 17 to read as follows:

p. 1

(1) Washington State University shall establish the position of
vision impairments/orientation and mobility coordinator to be housed at
Washington State University-Vancouver. The coordinator shall:

4 (a) Recruit Washington students for preparation as teachers for5 children who are blind or visually impaired;

6 (b) Develop partnerships with school districts with Washington 7 schools that provide services to children who are blind or visually 8 impaired;

9 (c) Supervise enrolled students and coordinate experiences with 10 mentor teachers;

(d) Coordinate and instruct in the orientation and mobility summer curriculum as an adjunct faculty;

(e) Serve as a liaison between Portland State University andWashington State University-Vancouver; and

(f) Seek grants and independent funding sources for the program.

16 (2) Washington State University may solicit, accept, receive, and 17 administer federal funds or private funds, in trust or otherwise, and 18 contract with foundations or with for-profit or nonprofit organizations 19 to support the purposes of this section.
