As childhood obesity rates rise, it is 8 9 important to ensure that children have the time for physical activity. 10 Insufficient physical activity and excessive calories consumed is well-11 known as a critical factor for this alarming increase in overweight and obese children. As Washington state strives to be the healthiest state 12 13 in the nation, we must continue to encourage our children to engage in
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) The office of the superintendent shall collaborate with the statewide parent-teacher organization to conduct and report the results of a survey of Washington elementary schools to determine the current availability of recess for elementary students

physical activity so they can develop a healthy mind and body.

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and the perceptions of the importance of recess in Washington elementary schools. The survey shall include, but not be limited to, the following inquiries:

- (a) How much time does the elementary school devote for recess each day?
- (b) Whether the amount of time devoted to recess has decreased or increased and why?
 - (c) Is recess a structured or unstructured activity at the school?
 - (d) How is recess provided during inclement weather?

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- (e) If recess is part of the scheduled day at your school, may an individual teacher keep a student from participating in recess for academic or discipline reasons?
- 13 (f) Do you believe that recess is a necessary part of the school 14 day?
- 15 (2) By December 1, 2009, the responses to the survey shall be 16 aggregated and reported to the appropriate committees of the 17 legislature.

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
