## SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5734

1 AN ACT Relating to tuition fees; and amending RCW 28B.15.067.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

3 Sec. 1. RCW 28B.15.067 and 2007 c 355 s 7 are each amended to read 4 as follows:

5 (1) Tuition fees shall be established under the provisions of this 6 chapter.

7 (2) Beginning with the 2003-04 academic year and ending with the 8 ((<del>2008-09</del>)) <u>2014-15</u> academic year, reductions or increases in full-time 9 tuition fees for resident undergraduates shall be as provided in the 10 omnibus appropriations act.

(3) Beginning with the 2003-04 academic year and ending with the 11 ((<del>2008-09</del>)) <u>2014-15</u> academic year, the governing boards of the state 12 13 universities, the regional universities, The Evergreen State College, 14 and the state board for community and technical colleges may reduce or increase full-time tuition fees for all students other than resident 15 16 undergraduates, including summer school students and students in other 17 self-supporting degree programs. Percentage increases in full-time 18 tuition fees may exceed the fiscal growth factor. Reductions or

increases may be made for all or portions of an institution's programs,
 campuses, courses, or students.

(4) Academic year tuition for full-time students at the state's
institutions of higher education beginning with ((2009-10)) 2015-16,
other than summer term, shall be as charged during the ((2008-09))
2014-15 academic year unless different rates are adopted by the
legislature.

8 (5) The tuition fees established under this chapter shall not apply 9 to high school students enrolling in participating institutions of 10 higher education under RCW 28A.600.300 through 28A.600.400.

11 (6) The tuition fees established under this chapter shall not apply 12 to eligible students enrolling in a community or technical college 13 under RCW 28C.04.610.

14 (7) The tuition fees established under this chapter shall not apply 15 to eligible students enrolling in a community or technical college 16 participating in the pilot program under RCW 28B.50.534 for the purpose 17 of obtaining a high school diploma.

18 (8) For the academic years 2003-04 through 2008-09, the University 19 of Washington shall use an amount equivalent to ten percent of all 20 revenues received as a result of law school tuition increases beginning 21 in academic year 2000-01 through academic year 2008-09 to assist needy 22 low and middle\_income resident law students.

(9) For the academic years 2003-04 through 2008-09, institutions of higher education shall use an amount equivalent to ten percent of all revenues received as a result of graduate academic school tuition increases beginning in academic year 2003-04 through academic year 2008-09 to assist needy low and middle-income resident graduate academic students.

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
