## SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5802

State of Washington 61st Legislature 2009 Regular Session

**By** Senate Early Learning & K-12 Education (originally sponsored by Senators Oemig, McAuliffe, Hobbs, Kauffman, Jarrett, Tom, and Shin; by request of Governor Gregoire)

1 AN ACT Relating to the professional educator standards board 2 membership and duties; amending RCW 28A.410.200, 28A.410.100, and 3 28A.410.210; adding a new section to chapter 28A.410 RCW; and providing 4 an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.410 7 RCW to read as follows:

8 The professional educator standards board shall:

9 (1) Develop and maintain a research base of educator preparation 10 best practices;

(2) Develop and coordinate initiatives for educator preparation in high-demand fields as well as outreach and recruitment initiatives for underrepresented populations;

14 (3) Provide program improvement technical assistance to providers15 of educator preparation programs;

16 (4) Assure educator preparation program compliance; and

17 (5) Prepare and maintain a cohesive educator development policy18 framework.

1 Sec. 2. RCW 28A.410.200 and 2005 c 497 s 202 are each amended to
2 read as follows:

3 (1)(a) The Washington professional educator standards board is 4 created, consisting of ((twenty)) twelve members to be appointed by the 5 governor to four-year terms and the superintendent of public 6 instruction. <u>On August 1, 2009, the board shall be reduced to twelve</u> 7 members by ending the terms of the appointed members with the least 8 amount of time remaining in their terms.

9 (b) ((As the four-year terms of the first appointees expire or)) 10 Vacancies ((to)) on the board ((occur for the first time,)) shall be filled by appointment or reappointment by the governor ((shall appoint 11 12 or reappoint the members of the board to one-year to four-year 13 staggered terms. Once the one-year to three-year terms expire, all subsequent terms shall be for)) to terms of four years((, with the 14 15 terms expiring on June 30th of the applicable year. The terms shall be staggered in such a way that, where possible, the terms of members 16 17 representing a specific group do not expire simultaneously)).

18 (c) No person may serve as a member of the board for more than two 19 consecutive full four-year terms.

(d) The governor shall ((annually)) biennially appoint the chair of the board ((from among the teachers and principals on the board)). No board member may serve as chair for more than ((two)) four consecutive years.

(2) ((Seven of the members shall be public school teachers, one shall be a private school teacher, three shall represent higher education educator preparation programs, four shall be school administrators, two shall be educational staff associates, one shall be a classified employee who assists in public school student instruction, one shall be a parent, and one shall be a member of the public.

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(3) Public school teachers appointed to the board must:

31 (a) Have at least three years of teaching experience in a
32 Washington public school;

33 (b) Be currently certificated and actively employed in a teaching 34 position; and

35 (c) Include one teacher currently teaching at the elementary school 36 level, one at the middle school level, one at the high school level, 37 and one vocationally certificated.

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(4) Private school teachers appointed to the board must:

- (a) Have at least three years of teaching experience in a
   Washington approved private school; and
- 3 (b) Be currently certificated and actively employed in a teaching
   4 position in an approved private school.

5 (5) Appointees from higher education educator preparation programs 6 must include two representatives from institutions of higher education 7 as defined in RCW 28B.10.016 and one representative from an institution 8 of higher education as defined in RCW 28B.07.020(4).

(6) School administrators appointed to the board must:

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10 (a) Have at least three years of administrative experience in a 11 Washington public school district;

12 (b) Be currently certificated and actively employed in a school 13 administrator position; and

14 (c) Include two public school principals, one Washington approved 15 private school principal, and one superintendent.

16 (7) Educational staff associates appointed to the board must:

17 (a) Have at least three years of educational staff associate
18 experience in a Washington public school district; and

- 19 (b) Be currently certificated and actively employed in an 20 educational staff associate position.
- 21 (8) Public school classified employees appointed to the board must:

22 (a) Have at least three years of experience in assisting in the 23 instruction of students in a Washington public school; and

24 (b) Be currently employed in a position that requires the employee
25 to assist in the instruction of students.

26 (9) Each major caucus of the house of representatives and the 27 senate shall submit a list of at least one public school teacher. In making the public school teacher appointments, the governor shall 28 select one nominee from each list provided by each caucus. The 29 governor shall appoint the remaining members of the board from a list 30 31 of qualified nominees submitted to the governor by organizations representative of the constituencies of the board, from applications 32 from other qualified individuals, or from both nominees and applicants. 33 34 (10) All appointments to the board made by the governor shall be 35 subject to confirmation by the senate.

36 (11) The governor shall appoint the members of the initial board no
37 later than June 1, 2000.

- (12) In appointing board members, the governor shall consider the
   diversity of the population of the state.
- 3 (13)) <u>A majority of the members of the board shall be active</u>
  4 practitioners with the majority being classroom based. Membership on
  5 the board shall include individuals having one or more of the
  6 following:
- 7 (a) Experience in one or more of the education roles for which 8 state preparation program approval is required and certificates issued; 9 (b) Experience providing or leading a state-approved preparation 10 program;
- 11 (c) Experience providing mentoring and coaching to education 12 professionals or others; and
- 13 (d) Education-related community experience.
- 14 (3) In appointing board members, the governor shall consider the 15 individual's commitment to quality education and the ongoing 16 improvement of instruction, experiences in the public schools, 17 involvement in developing quality teaching preparation and support 18 programs, and vision for the most effective yet practical system of 19 assuring teaching quality. The governor shall also consider the 20 diversity of the population of the state.
- 21 (4) Each member of the board shall be compensated in accordance 22 with RCW 43.03.240 and shall be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred 23 in carrying out the duties of the board in accordance with RCW 24 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.
- (((14))) (5) The governor may remove a member of the board for 25 26 neglect of duty, misconduct, malfeasance or misfeasance in office, or 27 for incompetency or unprofessional conduct as defined in chapter 18.130 In such a case, the governor shall file with the secretary of 28 RCW. state a statement of the causes for and the order of removal from 29 30 office, and the secretary of state shall send a certified copy of the statement of causes and order of removal to the last known post office 31 address of the member. 32
- 33 (((15) If a vacancy occurs on the board, the governor shall appoint 34 a replacement member from the nominees as specified in subsection (9) 35 of this section to fill the remainder of the unexpired term. When 36 filling a vacancy of a member nominated by a major caucus of the 37 legislature, the governor shall select the new member from a list of at

1 least one name submitted by the same caucus that provided the list from 2 which the retiring member was appointed.

3 (16)) (6) Members of the board shall hire an executive director
4 and an administrative assistant to reside in the office of the
5 superintendent of public instruction for administrative purposes only.

6 <u>(7) Members of the board may create informal advisory groups as</u> 7 <u>needed to inform the board's work.</u>

8 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28A.410.100 and 2005 c 497 s 207 are each amended to 9 read as follows:

Any teacher whose certificate to teach has been questioned under RCW 28A.410.090 shall have a right to be heard by the issuing authority before his or her certificate is revoked. ((Any teacher whose certificate to teach has been revoked shall have a right of appeal to the Washington professional educator standards board if notice of appeal is given by written affidavit to the board within thirty days after the certificate is revoked.

An appeal to the Washington professional educator standards board within the time specified shall operate as a stay of revocation proceedings until the next regular or special meeting of said board and until the board's decision has been rendered.))

21 **Sec. 4.** RCW 28A.410.210 and 2008 c 176 s 1 are each amended to 22 read as follows:

The purpose of the professional educator standards board is to 23 24 establish policies and requirements for the preparation and 25 certification of educators that provide standards for competency in 26 professional knowledge and practice in the areas of certification; a 27 foundation of skills, knowledge, and attitudes necessary to help 28 students with diverse needs, abilities, cultural experiences, and learning styles meet or exceed the learning goals outlined in RCW 29 30 28A.150.210; knowledge of research-based practice; and professional development throughout a career. The Washington professional educator 31 standards board shall: 32

(1) Establish policies and practices for the approval of programs of courses, requirements, and other activities leading to educator certification including teacher, school administrator, and educational staff associate certification;

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1 (2) Establish policies and practices for the approval of the 2 character of work required to be performed as a condition of entrance 3 to and graduation from any educator preparation program including 4 teacher, school administrator, and educational staff associate 5 preparation program as provided in subsection (1) of this section;

6 (3) Establish a list of accredited institutions of higher education 7 of this and other states whose graduates may be awarded educator 8 certificates as teacher, school administrator, and educational staff 9 associate and establish criteria and enter into agreements with other 10 states to acquire reciprocal approval of educator preparation programs 11 and certification, including teacher certification from the national 12 board for professional teaching standards;

13 (4) Establish policies for approval of nontraditional educator 14 preparation programs;

(5) Conduct a review of educator program approval standards at least every five years, beginning in 2006, to reflect research findings and assure continued improvement of preparation programs for teachers, administrators, and school specialized personnel;

19 (6) Specify the types and kinds of educator certificates to be 20 issued and conditions for certification in accordance with subsection 21 (1) of this section and RCW 28A.410.010;

(7) ((Hear and determine educator certification appeals as provided
 by RCW 28A.410.100;

(8)) Apply for and receive federal or other funds on behalf of the
 state for purposes related to the duties of the board;

26 (((-9))) <u>(8)</u> Adopt rules under chapter 34.05 RCW that are necessary 27 for the effective and efficient implementation of this chapter;

28 ((<del>(10)</del>)) <u>(9)</u> Maintain data concerning educator preparation programs 29 and their quality, educator certification, educator employment trends 30 and needs, and other data deemed relevant by the board;

31 ((<del>(11)</del>)) <u>(10)</u> Serve as an advisory body to the superintendent of 32 public instruction on issues related to educator recruitment, hiring, 33 mentoring and support, professional growth, retention, educator 34 evaluation including but not limited to peer evaluation, and revocation 35 and suspension of licensure;

36 ((<del>(12)</del>)) <u>(11)</u> Submit, by October 15th of each even-numbered year, 37 a joint report with the state board of education to the legislative 38 education committees, the governor, and the superintendent of public

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1 instruction. The report shall address the progress the boards have 2 made and the obstacles they have encountered, individually and 3 collectively, in the work of achieving the goals set out in RCW 4 28A.150.210;

5 ((<del>(13)</del>)) <u>(12)</u> Establish the prospective teacher assessment system 6 for basic skills and subject knowledge that shall be required to obtain 7 residency certification pursuant to RCW 28A.410.220 through 8 28A.410.240;

9 ((<del>(14)</del>)) <u>(13)</u> By January 2010, set performance standards and 10 develop, pilot, and implement a uniform and externally administered 11 professional-level certification assessment based on demonstrated 12 teaching skill. In the development of this assessment, consideration 13 shall be given to changes in professional certification program 14 components such as the culminating seminar; and

15 ((<del>(15)</del>)) <u>(14)</u> Conduct meetings under the provisions of chapter 16 42.30 RCW.
