1 AN ACT Relating to entrepreneurial education and training; and 2 amending RCW 43.162.020.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.162.020 and 2007 c 232 s 4 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) The Washington state economic development commission shall:

7 (a) Concentrate its major efforts ((+1))on planning, 8 coordination, evaluation, policy analysis, and recommending 9 improvements to the state's economic development system using, but not 10 limited to, the "Next Washington" plan and the global competitiveness 11 council recommendations;

12 (((2))) (b) Develop and maintain on a biennial basis a state 13 comprehensive plan for economic development, including but not limited 14 to goals, objectives, and priorities for the state economic development 15 system; identify the elements local associate development organizations 16 must include in their countywide economic development plans; and review 17 the state system for consistency with the state comprehensive plan. In 18 developing the state comprehensive plan for economic development, the commission shall use, but may not be limited to: Economic, labor 19

market, and populations trend reports in office of financial management 1 2 forecasts; the annual state economic climate report prepared by the economic climate council; joint office of financial management and 3 4 employment security department labor force, industry employment, and occupational forecasts; the results of scientifically based outcome 5 6 evaluations; the needs of industry associations, industry clusters, 7 businesses, and employees as evidenced in formal surveys and other 8 input;

9 (((3))) (c) Establish and maintain an inventory of the programs of 10 the state economic development system and related state programs; perform a biennial assessment of the ongoing and strategic economic 11 12 development needs of the state; and assess the extent to which the 13 development system and related programs economic represent а 14 consistent, coordinated, efficient, and integrated approach to meet 15 such needs; ((and

16 (4)) (d) Produce a biennial report to the governor and the 17 legislature on progress by the commission in coordinating the state's 18 economic development system and meeting the other obligations of this 19 chapter, as well as include recommendations for any statutory changes 20 necessary to enhance operational efficiencies or improve coordination; 21 and

22 (e) In conjunction with the workforce training and education 23 coordinating board:

24 (i) Establish and maintain an inventory of the entrepreneurial and 25 innovation education, training, and technical assistance services and 26 programs available in the state;

27 (ii) Evaluate the extent to which existing entrepreneurial and 28 innovation training and technical assistance programs in the state are 29 effective and represent a consistent, integrated approach to meeting 30 the needs of start-up and existing entrepreneurs;

(iii) Identify policies to reduce administrative and other barriers
to efficient delivery and coordination of entrepreneurial assistance;
(iv) Distribute awards for excellence in entrepreneurial training

35 (v) Distribute awards for excellence in innovation training; and 36 (vi) Report to the governor, the workforce training and education 37 coordinating board, and the appropriate legislative committees its 1 recommendations for statutory changes necessary to enhance operational

2 efficiencies or enhance coordination related to entrepreneurial and

3 <u>innovation education, training, and assistance</u>.

4 (2) The commission may delegate to the <u>executive</u> director any of 5 the functions of this section.

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
