- 1 AN ACT Relating to the disposition of existing voter-approved
- 2 indebtedness at the time of annexation of a city, partial city, or town

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 52.04 RCW 7 to read as follows:
- 8 All property located within the boundaries of a city, partial city
- 9 as set forth in RCW 52.04.061(2), or town annexing into a fire
- 10 protection district, which property is subject to an excess levy by the
- 11 city or town for the repayment of voter-approved indebtedness for fire
- 12 protection related capital improvements incurred prior to the effective
- 13 date of the annexation is exempt from voter-approved excess property
- 14 taxes levied by the annexing fire protection district for the repayment
- 15 of indebtedness issued prior to the effective date of the annexation.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 17 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the

- 1 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 2 immediately.
