#### **Brief Summary of Bill**

• Makes changes to the scope of practice for licensed Naturopaths.

#### Background:

Naturopathic medicine is the art and science of the diagnosis, prevention, and treatment of disorders of the body through the natural processes of the body. Naturopathic medicine includes:

- manipulation (mechanotherapy);
- the prescription, dispensing, and use of nutrition and food science;
- physical modalities; i.e., the use of physical, chemical, electrical, and other <u>non-invasive</u> modalities such as heat, cold air, light, water in any of its forms, sound, massage, and therapeutic exercise;
- minor office procedures;
- homeopathy;
- naturopathic medicines;
- hygiene and immunization;
- non-drug contraceptive devices;
- common diagnostic procedures; and
- suggestion.

### **Summary of Bill**:

This analysis was prepared by non-partisan legislative staff for the use of legislative members in their deliberations. This analysis is not a part of the legislation nor does it constitute a statement of legislative intent.

House Bill Analysis - 1 - HB 1228

Naturopaths are no longer limited to <u>non-invasive</u> physical modalities and <u>non-drug</u> contraceptive devices. Instead, Naturopaths are authorized to use physical modalities and contraceptive devices.
