## **HB 1353**

**Brief Description**: Concerning continuing education for pharmacy technicians.

#### **Brief Summary of Bill**

• Requires certified pharmacy technicians to complete continuing education requirements.

#### Background:

Certified pharmacy technicians provide assistance to licensed pharmacists by performing manipulative, non-discretionary functions associated with the practice of pharmacy. In addition, pharmacy technicians who meet criteria for employment, experience, training, and proficiency may perform specialized functions such as unit-dose medication checking and parenteral preparations. Pharmacy technicians may only practice while under the immediate supervision of a licensed pharmacist.

In order to be certified, a pharmacy technician must:

- be a high school graduate or successfully complete general education development tests;
- complete a formal pharmacy technician training program approved by the Board of Pharmacy or an on-the-job pharmacy technician training program approved by the Board of Pharmacy; and
- pass a national standardized pharmacy technician certification examination.

Pharmacy technicians are not subject to continuing education requirements.

### **Summary of Bill**:

Certified pharmacy technicians must complete continuing education requirements established by the Board of Pharmacy.

**Effective Date**: The bill takes effect 90 days after adjournment of the session in which the bill is passed.
