Background: Currently, there are 36 special license plates displaying a symbol, artwork, or wording that honor various veteran groups, universities, organizations, parks and the environment, sports and hobbies, and service organizations and associations which are available through the Department of Licensing. The special license plates are available for use in lieu of regular or personalized license plates. All 36 of the special license plates are available for use on automobiles, however only 24 of the 36 special license plates are currently available for motorcycles.

Summary of Bill: The bill as referred to committee not considered.

Summary of Bill (Proposed Substitute): The Department of Licensing will make all special license plates, which were previously available to automobiles but not motorcycles, available for motorcycles. The special license plates that will become available for motorcycles include the following:
