## SENATE BILL REPORT SB 5554

Title: An act relating to identifying marks on ballots.

Brief Description: Preventing rejection of ballots that have voter identifying marks.

**Background**: One criteria for paper ballots issued by an election official is that the election official may not mark them in any way that would permit the voter to be identified.

**Summary of Bill**: No ballot may contain an encrypted or unencrypted bar code or other unique identifying mark other than a randomly assigned, unique mark not associated with an individual voter, a voter's address, or a voter's registration number. The purpose of the allowed mark may only be for auditing, vote-reconciliation, or to determine if the ballot has been counted.

Effective Date: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.
