Background: The Liquor Control Board (Board) operates the state liquor stores; oversees contract liquor stores; issues liquor licenses and permits; regulates the manufacture, distribution, and sale of beer and wine; enforces liquor and tobacco laws; conducts education; and collects taxes.

Under current law, products the Board sells in state liquor stores are limited to liquor.

Summary of Bill: The Board may sell liquor related products in state liquor stores on consignment.

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Requested on April 5, 2011.

Effective Date: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.
