AN ACT Relating to permitting federally recognized Indian tribes to certify counselors as agency affiliated counselors; and amending RCW 18.19.020.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.19.020 and 2010 1st sp.s. c 20 s 1 are each amended 6 to read as follows:

7 The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter 8 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

9 (1) "Agency" means (a) an agency or facility operated, licensed, or 10 certified by the state of Washington ((or)); (b) <u>a federally recognized</u> 11 <u>Indian tribe located within the state; or (c)</u> a county.

(2) "Agency affiliated counselor" means a person registered under 12 13 this chapter who is engaged in counseling and employed by an agency. 14 "Agency affiliated counselor" includes juvenile probation counselors 15 who are employees of the juvenile court under RCW 13.04.035 and 16 13.04.040 and juvenile court employees providing functional family 17 therapy, aggression replacement training, or other evidence-based 18 programs approved by the juvenile rehabilitation administration of the 19 department of social and health services.

(3) "Certified adviser" means a person certified under this chapter
 who is engaged in private practice counseling to the extent authorized
 in RCW 18.19.200.

4 (4) "Certified counselor" means a person certified under this
5 chapter who is engaged in private practice counseling to the extent
6 authorized in RCW 18.19.200.

7 (5) "Client" means an individual who receives or participates in8 counseling or group counseling.

(6) "Counseling" means employing any therapeutic techniques, 9 10 including but not limited to social work, mental health counseling, 11 marriage and family therapy, and hypnotherapy, for a fee that offer, 12 assist or attempt to assist an individual or individuals in the 13 amelioration or adjustment of mental, emotional, or behavioral problems, and includes therapeutic techniques to achieve sensitivity 14 and awareness of self and others and the development of human 15 potential. For the purposes of this chapter, nothing may be construed 16 17 to imply that the practice of hypnotherapy is necessarily limited to 18 counseling.

19 (7) "Counselor" means an individual, practitioner, therapist, or 20 analyst who engages in the practice of counseling to the public for a 21 fee, including for the purposes of this chapter, hypnotherapists.

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(8) "Department" means the department of health.

(9) "Hypnotherapist" means a person registered under this chapterwho is practicing hypnosis as a modality.

(10) "Private practice counseling" means the practice of counseling by a certified counselor or certified adviser as specified in RCW 18.19.200.

(11) "Psychotherapy" means the practice of counseling using diagnosis of mental disorders according to the fourth edition of the diagnostic and statistical manual of mental disorders, published in 1994, and the development of treatment plans for counseling based on diagnosis of mental disorders in accordance with established practice standards.

34 (12) "Secretary" means the secretary of the department or the 35 secretary's designee.

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
