- 1 AN ACT Relating to preventing storm water pollution from coal tar
- 2 sealants; and adding a new chapter to Title 70 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 6 (1) "Coal tar" means a material that contains coal tar identified 7 by chemical abstract number 8007-45-2.
- 8 (2) "Coal tar pavement product" means a material that contains coal 9 tar that is intended for use as a pavement sealant.
- 10 (3) "Department" means the department of ecology.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) After January 1, 2012, no person may
- 12 sell at wholesale or retail a coal tar pavement product that is labeled
- 13 as containing coal tar.
- 14 (2) After July 1, 2012, a person may not apply a coal tar pavement
- 15 product on a driveway or parking area.
- 16 (3) The department may issue a notice of corrective action to a
- 17 person in violation of subsection (1) or (2) of this section.

- 1 (4) A city or county may adopt an ordinance providing for 2 enforcement of the requirements of subsection (1) or (2) of this 3 section. A city or county adopting an ordinance has jurisdiction 4 concurrent with the department to enforce this section.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** Sections 1 and 2 of this act constitute a 6 new chapter in Title 70 RCW.
