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AN ACT Relating to voter registration for sixteen and seventeen year olds; amending RCW 29A.08.210, 29A.08.330, and 46.20.155; adding a new section to chapter 29A.08 RCW; creating a new section; and providing an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

б NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes the importance of 7 fostering lifelonq civic participation. Young voters remain 8 underrepresented in the United States electorate. Nationally, fiftynine percent of eligible eighteen to twenty-nine year olds are 9 10 registered to vote, compared to seventy-one percent in the general 11 population. Registration supports voter turnout among young adults: 12 Eighty-three percent of registered eighteen to twenty-nine year olds in the United States voted in 2008. Studies show that young adults who 13 vote are likely to continue to do so throughout adulthood. 14 The legislature recognizes that these representational disparities in 15 registration rates and voting rates within the youth electorate will 16 improve by enacting election policies that engage all young citizens. 17 Therefore, the legislature declares that this act, allowing eligible 18

youth at least sixteen years of age to register to vote, is intended to
 increase voter turnout in young adults.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 29A.08 RCW
4 to read as follows:

5 (1) A person who is at least sixteen years of age and who meets all 6 requirements to vote except age may register to vote with the office of 7 the secretary of state.

8 (2) The voter's registration will be held from entry in the 9 statewide voter registration database until such time as the voter will 10 be eighteen years of age before the next election.

(3) A confirmation notice will be sent to the voter's address at the time the voter's registration is entered into the statewide voter registration database.

14 (4) The secretary of state is authorized to adopt rules to 15 implement this section. In promulgating such rules, the secretary of 16 state should endeavor to maintain an accurate record of the current 17 residential addresses of registrants.

18 Sec. 3. RCW 29A.08.210 and 2009 c 369 s 16 are each amended to 19 read as follows:

20 An applicant for voter registration shall complete an application 21 providing the following information concerning his or her 22 qualifications as a voter in this state:

23 (1) The former address of the applicant if previously registered to 24 vote;

25 (2) The applicant's full name;

26 (3) The applicant's date of birth;

27 (4) The address of the applicant's residence for voting purposes;

(5) The mailing address of the applicant if that address is not thesame as the address in subsection (4) of this section;

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(6) The sex of the applicant;

31 (7) The applicant's Washington state driver's license number, 32 Washington state identification card number, or the last four digits of 33 the applicant's social security number if he or she does not have a 34 Washington state driver's license or Washington state identification 35 card; (8) A check box allowing the applicant to indicate that he or she
 is a member of the armed forces, national guard, or reserves, or that
 he or she is an overseas voter;

4 (9) ((A)) <u>Two</u> check box<u>es</u> allowing the applicant to confirm ((that
5 he or she)) <u>one of the following:</u>

6 <u>(a) The applicant</u> is at least eighteen years of age or will be 7 eighteen years of age by the next election;

8 (b) The applicant is at least sixteen years of age, meets all 9 requirements to vote except age, and understands that the registration 10 will be held until such time as the applicant is eligible to vote at 11 the next election;

12 (10) Clear and conspicuous language, designed to draw the 13 applicant's attention, stating that the applicant must be a United 14 States citizen in order to register to vote;

(11) A check box and declaration confirming that the applicant isa citizen of the United States;

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(12) The following warning:

18 "If you knowingly provide false information on this voter 19 registration form or knowingly make a false declaration about your 20 qualifications for voter registration you will have committed a class 21 C felony that is punishable by imprisonment for up to five years, a 22 fine of up to ten thousand dollars, or both."

23 (13) The oath required by RCW 29A.08.230 and a space for the 24 applicant's signature; and

(14) Any other information that the secretary of state determines
is necessary to establish the identity of the applicant and prevent
duplicate or fraudulent voter registrations.

This information shall be recorded on a single registration form to be prescribed by the secretary of state.

30 **Sec. 4.** RCW 29A.08.330 and 2009 c 369 s 20 are each amended to 31 read as follows:

(1) The secretary of state shall prescribe the method of voter registration for each designated agency. The agency shall use either the state voter registration by mail form with a separate declination form for the applicant to indicate that he or she declines to register at this time, or the agency may use a separate form approved for use by the secretary of state.

(2) The person providing service at the agency shall offer voter 1 2 registration services to every client whenever he or she applies for service or assistance and with each renewal, recertification, or change 3 of address. The person providing service shall give the applicant the 4 5 same level of assistance with the voter registration application as is offered to fill out the agency's forms and documents, including 6 7 information about age and citizenship requirements for voter 8 registration.

9 (3) The person providing service at the agency shall determine if 10 the prospective applicant wants to register to vote or transfer his or 11 her voter registration by asking the following question:

12 "Do you want to register to vote or transfer your voter 13 registration?"

14 If the applicant chooses to register or transfer a registration, 15 the service agent shall ask the following:

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(a) "Are you a United States citizen?"

17 (b) "Are you ((or will you be eighteen)) at least sixteen years of 18 age ((on or before the next election))?"

19 If the applicant answers in the affirmative to both questions, the 20 agent shall then provide the applicant with a voter registration form 21 and instructions and shall record that the applicant has requested to 22 register to vote or transfer a voter registration. If the applicant 23 answers in the negative to either question, the agent shall not provide 24 the applicant with a voter registration form.

(4) If an agency uses a computerized application process, it may, in consultation with the secretary of state, develop methods to capture simultaneously the information required for voter registration during a person's computerized application process.

(5) Each designated agency shall transmit the applications to the
 secretary of state or appropriate county auditor within three business
 days.

32 **Sec. 5.** RCW 46.20.155 and 2009 c 369 s 42 are each amended to read 33 as follows:

34 (1) Before issuing an original license or identicard or renewing a35 license or identicard under this chapter, the licensing agent shall

1 determine if the applicant wants to register to vote or transfer his or
2 her voter registration by asking the following question:

3 "Do you want to register to vote or transfer your voter 4 registration?"

5 If the applicant chooses to register or transfer a registration, 6 the agent shall ask the following:

7 (1) "Are you a United States citizen?"

8 (2) "Are you ((or will you be eighteen)) at least sixteen years of
9 age ((on or before the next election))?"

10 If the applicant answers in the affirmative to both questions, the 11 agent shall then submit the registration or transfer. If the applicant 12 answers in the negative to either question, the agent shall not submit 13 a voter registration application.

14 (2) The department shall establish a procedure that substantially 15 meets the requirements of subsection (1) of this section when 16 permitting an applicant to renew a license or identicard by mail or by 17 electronic commerce.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. This act takes effect July 1, 2013.

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
