AN ACT Relating to constraints of expenditures for WorkFirst and child care programs; amending RCW 43.88C.010; adding a new section to chapter 74.08A RCW; repealing RCW 74.08A.340; and providing an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 74.08A RCW 7 to read as follows:

8 The department of social and health services shall operate the 9 Washington WorkFirst program authorized under RCW 74.08A.210 through 10 74.08A.330, 43.330.145, 43.215.545, and 74.25.040, and chapter 74.12 11 RCW within the following constraints:

12 (1) The program shall be operated within amounts appropriated by 13 the legislature and consistent with policy established by the 14 legislature and the legislative-executive WorkFirst oversight task 15 force as provided in RCW 74.08A.260 to achieve self-sufficiency through 16 work and the following additional outcomes:

17 (a) Recipients' economic status is improving through wage18 progression, job retention, and educational advancement;

(b) Recipients' status regarding housing stability, medical andbehavioral health, and job readiness is improving;

3 (c) The well-being of children whose caretaker is receiving 4 benefits on their behalf is improving with respect to child welfare and 5 educational achievement.

6 (2)(a) The department shall create a budget structure that allows
7 for more transparent tracking of program spending. The budget
8 structure shall outline spending for the following: Temporary
9 assistance for needy family grants, working connections child care,
10 WorkFirst activities and administration of the program.

(b) Each biennium, the department shall establish a biennial 11 12 spending plan, using the budget structure created in (a) of this 13 subsection, for this program and submit the plan to the legislative 14 fiscal committees and the legislative-executive WorkFirst oversight task force no later than July 1st of every odd-numbered year, beginning 15 16 on July 1, 2013. The department shall update the legislative fiscal 17 committees and the task force on the spending plan if modifications are made to the plan previously submitted to the legislature and the task 18 force for that biennium. 19

(c) The department also shall provide expenditure reports to the 20 21 fiscal committees of the legislature and the legislative-executive 22 WorkFirst oversight task force beginning September 1, 2012, and on a quarterly basis thereafter. If the department determines, based upon 23 24 quarterly expenditure reports, that expenditures will exceed funding at 25 the end of the fiscal year, the department shall take those actions necessary to ensure that services provided under this chapter are 26 27 available only to the extent of and consistent with appropriations in the operating budget and policy established by the legislature 28 following notification provided in (b) of this subsection. 29

30 (3) No more than fifteen percent of the temporary assistance for 31 needy families block grant, the federal child care funds, and 32 qualifying state expenditures may be spent for administrative purposes. 33 For purposes of this subsection, "administrative purposes" does not 34 include expenditures for information technology and computerization 35 needed for tracking and monitoring required by P.L. 104-193.

36 (4) The department shall expend funds appropriated for work
37 activities, as defined in RCW 74.08A.250, or for other services
38 provided to WorkFirst recipients, as authorized under RCW 74.08A.290.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. RCW 74.08A.340 (Funding restrictions) and 2009 c 564 s 953, 2008 c 329 s 922, 2007 c 522 s 957, 2006 c 265 s 209, & 1997 c 58 s 321 are each repealed.

4 **Sec. 3.** RCW 43.88C.010 and 2011 c 304 s 2 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) The caseload forecast council is hereby created. The council 7 shall consist of two individuals appointed by the governor and four 8 individuals, one of whom is appointed by the chairperson of each of the 9 largest political caucuses in the senate and two house of representatives. The chair of the council shall be selected from among 10 the four caucus appointees. The council may select such other officers 11 as the members deem necessary. 12

13 (2) The council shall employ a caseload forecast supervisor to 14 supervise the preparation of all caseload forecasts. As used in this 15 chapter, "supervisor" means the caseload forecast supervisor.

16 (3) Approval by an affirmative vote of at least five members of the 17 council is required for any decisions regarding employment of the supervisor. Employment of the supervisor shall terminate after each 18 term of three years. At the end of the first year of each three-year 19 20 term the council shall consider extension of the supervisor's term by 21 one year. The council may fix the compensation of the supervisor. The supervisor shall employ staff sufficient to accomplish the purposes of 22 this section. 23

(4) The caseload forecast council shall oversee the preparation of and approve, by an affirmative vote of at least four members, the official state caseload forecasts prepared under RCW 43.88C.020. If the council is unable to approve a forecast before a date required in RCW 43.88C.020, the supervisor shall submit the forecast without approval and the forecast shall have the same effect as if approved by the council.

31 (5) A councilmember who does not cast an affirmative vote for 32 approval of the official caseload forecast may request, and the 33 supervisor shall provide, an alternative forecast based on assumptions 34 specified by the member.

35 (6) Members of the caseload forecast council shall serve without 36 additional compensation but shall be reimbursed for travel expenses in 37 accordance with RCW 44.04.120 while attending sessions of the council

or on official business authorized by the council. Nonlegislative
 members of the council shall be reimbursed for travel expenses in
 accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

(7) "Caseload," as used in this chapter, means:

5 (a) The number of persons expected to meet entitlement requirements 6 and require the services of public assistance programs, state 7 correctional institutions, state correctional noninstitutional 8 supervision, state institutions for juvenile offenders, the common 9 school system, long-term care, medical assistance, foster care, and 10 adoption support;

(b) The number of students who are eligible for the Washington college bound scholarship program and are expected to attend an institution of higher education as defined in RCW 28B.92.030.

14 (8) <u>The caseload forecast council shall forecast the temporary</u> 15 <u>assistance for needy families and the working connections child care</u> 16 <u>programs as a courtesy.</u>

<u>(9)</u> Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions
 provided in RCW 43.88.020 apply to this chapter.

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. This act takes effect July 1, 2012.
