1            AN ACT Relating to volunteer firefighter special license plates;  
2 amending RCW 46.18.200, 46.17.220, and 46.68.420; reenacting and  
3 amending RCW 46.18.060; and providing an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5            **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.18.200 and 2010 c 161 s 611 are each amended to  
6 read as follows:

7            (1) ~~((The legislature recognizes that the special license plate  
8 review board established in RCW 46.16.705 reviews and approves  
9 applications for special license plate series.~~

10            ~~(2))~~ Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the  
11 ~~((special license plate review board))~~ department:

12            (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized license  
13 plates for vehicles required to display one and two license plates  
14 unless otherwise specified;

15            (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the  
16 department;

17            (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter 46.87  
18 RCW; and

1 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the (~~special~~  
2 ~~license plate review board~~) department.

3 (~~(3) The special license plate review board approves, and~~) (2)  
4 The department approves and shall issue(~~(7)~~) the following special  
5 license plates:

LICENSE PLATE	DESCRIPTION, SYMBOL, OR ARTWORK
Armed forces collection	Recognizes the contribution of veterans, active duty military personnel, reservists, and members of the national guard, and includes six separate designs, each containing a symbol representing a different branch of the armed forces to include army, navy, air force, marine corps, coast guard, and national guard.
Endangered wildlife	Displays a symbol or artwork, approved by the special license plate review board and the legislature.
Gonzaga University alumni <u>association</u>	Recognizes the Gonzaga University alumni association.
Helping kids speak	Recognizes an organization that supports programs that provide no-cost speech pathology programs to children.
Keep kids safe	Recognizes efforts to prevent child abuse and neglect.
Law enforcement memorial	Honors law enforcement officers in Washington killed in the line of duty.
Professional firefighters and paramedics	Recognizes professional firefighters and paramedics who are members of the Washington state council of firefighters.
Share the road	Recognizes an organization that promotes bicycle safety and awareness education.
Ski & ride Washington	Recognizes the Washington snowsports industry.
<u>Volunteer firefighters</u>	<u>Recognizes volunteer firefighters.</u>
Washington lighthouses	Recognizes an organization that supports selected Washington state lighthouses and provides environmental education programs.
Washington state parks	Recognizes Washington state parks as premier destinations of uncommon quality that preserve significant natural, cultural, historical, and recreational resources.

13        ~~((4))~~ (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional  
14 firefighters and paramedics special license plates must show proof  
15 eligibility by providing a certificate of current membership from the  
16 Washington state council of firefighters.

17        (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license  
18 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten  
19 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b) have  
20 documentation of service from the district of the appropriate fire  
21 service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting service  
22 before ten years of service have been completed, the volunteer  
23 firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the department on the  
24 registration renewal date. If the volunteer firefighter stays in  
25 service for at least ten years and then leaves, the license plate may  
26 be retained by the former volunteer firefighter and as long as the  
27 license plate is retained for use the person will continue to pay the  
28 future registration renewals. A qualifying volunteer firefighter may  
29 have no more than one set of license plates per vehicle, and a maximum  
30 of two sets per applicant, for their personal vehicles. If the  
31 volunteer firefighter is convicted of a violation of RCW 46.61.502 or  
32 a felony, the license plates must be surrendered upon conviction.

33        **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.17.220 and 2010 c 161 s 521 are each amended to  
34 read as follows:

35        (1) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon

1 application for a vehicle registration in chapter (~~(46.16)~~) 46.16A RCW,  
 2 the holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special  
 3 license plate fee as listed in this section.

1 (3) Only the director or the director's designee may authorize  
2 expenditures from the accounts described in subsection (2) of this  
3 section. The accounts are subject to allotment procedures under  
4 chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for  
5 expenditures.

6 (4) Funds in the special license plate accounts described in  
7 subsection (2) of this section must be disbursed subject to the  
8 conditions described in subsection (2) of this section and under  
9 contract between the department and qualified nonprofit organizations  
10 that provide the services described in subsection (2) of this section.

11 (5) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit  
12 organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in  
13 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status under  
14 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization must  
15 meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

16 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.18.060 and 2010 1st sp.s. c 7 s 94 and 2010 c 161  
17 s 604 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

18 ~~(1) ((The creation of the board does not in any way preclude the~~  
19 ~~authority of the legislature to independently propose and enact special~~  
20 ~~license plate legislation.~~

21 ~~(2))~~ The ~~((board))~~ department must review and either approve or  
22 reject special license plate applications submitted by sponsoring  
23 organizations.

24 ~~((3))~~ (2) Duties of the ~~((board))~~ department include but are not  
25 limited to the following:

26 (a) Review and approve the annual financial reports submitted by  
27 sponsoring organizations with active special license plate series and  
28 present those annual financial reports to the ~~((senate and house~~  
29 ~~transportation committees))~~ joint transportation committee;

30 (b) Report annually to the ~~((senate and house of representatives~~  
31 ~~transportation committees))~~ joint transportation committee on the  
32 special license plate applications that were considered by the  
33 ~~((board))~~ department;

34 (c) Issue approval and rejection notification letters to sponsoring  
35 organizations, ~~((the department,))~~ the ~~((chairs of the senate and house~~  
36 ~~of representatives transportation committees))~~ joint transportation



1 committee, and the legislative sponsors identified in each application.  
2 The letters must be issued within seven days of making a determination  
3 on the status of an application; and

4 (d) Review annually the number of plates sold for each special  
5 license plate series created after January 1, 2003. The ((board))  
6 department may submit a recommendation to discontinue a special plate  
7 series to the ((chairs of the senate and house of representatives  
8 ~~transportation committees; and~~

9 ~~(e) Provide policy guidance and directions to the department~~  
10 ~~concerning the adoption of rules necessary to limit the number of~~  
11 ~~special license plates for which an organization or a governmental~~  
12 ~~entity may apply)) joint transportation committee.~~

13 ((+4)) (3) Except as provided in RCW 46.18.245, in order to assess  
14 the effects and impact of the proliferation of special license plates,  
15 the legislature declares a temporary moratorium on the issuance of any  
16 additional plates until July 1, 2011. During this period of time,  
17 ((the special license plate review board created in RCW 46.16.705 and))  
18 the department ((are)) is prohibited from accepting, reviewing,  
19 processing, or approving any applications. Additionally, a special  
20 license plate may not be enacted by the legislature during the  
21 moratorium, unless the proposed license plate has been approved by the  
22 former special license plate review board before February 15, 2005.

23 (4) The volunteer firefighters license plates created under RCW  
24 46.18.200 are exempt from the requirements of subsection (3) of this  
25 section.

26 NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. This act takes effect January 1, 2012.
