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## SENATE BILL 5548

- 1 AN ACT Relating to increasing the number of primary health care
- 2 providers in Washington; adding a new section to chapter 28B.115 RCW;
- 3 and creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that a severe shortage
- 6 of primary health care providers exists in Washington, particularly in
- 7 rural and underserved areas of the state. The legislature further
- 8 finds that an over reliance on specialty health care at the expense of
- 9 primary care results in a health care system that is less efficient.
- 10 The legislature further finds that institutions of higher education
- 11 must produce more primary care providers. The legislature further
- 12 finds that the efficient use of clinical sites for rotations and
- 13 residencies will expand the supply of primary care providers. The
- 14 legislature further finds that expanding residency programs in
- 15 community health centers will increase residents' exposure to primary
- 16 care practice.
- 17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.115
- 18 RCW to read as follows:

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Any entity receiving state funds may not prohibit a hospital or physician from entering into an agreement to provide student clinical rotations or residencies to qualified osteopathic or allopathic medical students.

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
