1 AN ACT Relating to consumer reports of employees or volunteers who 2 will or may have unsupervised access to children, individuals with 3 developmental disabilities, or vulnerable adults; and amending RCW 4 19.182.040.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 19.182.040 and 1993 c 476 s 6 are each amended to read 7 as follows:

8 (1) Except as authorized under subsection (2) of this section, no 9 consumer reporting agency may make a consumer report containing any of 10 the following items of information:

(a) Bankruptcies that, from date of adjudication of the most recentbankruptcy, antedate the report by more than ten years;

(b) Suits and judgments that, from date of entry, antedate the report by more than seven years or until the governing statute of limitations has expired, whichever is the longer period;

16 (c) Paid tax liens that, from date of payment, antedate the report 17 by more than seven years;

(d) Accounts placed for collection or charged to profit and lossthat antedate the report by more than seven years;

(e) Records of arrest, indictment, or conviction of crime that,
from date of disposition, release, or parole, antedate the report by
more than seven years;

4 (f) Any other adverse item of information that antedates the report5 by more than seven years.

6 (2) Subsection (1) of this section is not applicable in the case of 7 a consumer report to be used in connection with:

8 (a) A credit transaction involving, or that may reasonably be 9 expected to involve, a principal amount of fifty thousand dollars or 10 more;

(b) The underwriting of life insurance involving, or that may reasonably be expected to involve, a face amount of fifty thousand dollars or more; ((<del>or</del>))

14 (c) The employment of an individual at an annual salary that 15 equals, or that may reasonably be expected to equal, twenty thousand 16 dollars or more; or

17 (d) Any prospective employee or volunteer who will or may have 18 unsupervised access to children, individuals with developmental 19 disabilities, or vulnerable adults.
