- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that adopting statewide core competencies for early care and education professionals is important because the competencies:
  - (1) Define what early care and education professionals need to know and be able to do to provide quality care and education for children;
  - (2) Serve as the foundation for decisions and practices carried out by professionals in all early care and education settings;
- 12 (3) Establish a set of standards for early care and education 13 settings that support the professionalism for the field; and
- 14 (4) Are an integral part of a comprehensive professional 15 development system.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 43.215 RCW to read as follows:
- 18 By December 31, 2011, the department shall adopt core competencies

1 early care and education professionals and develop 2 implementation plan. The department shall incorporate the core competencies into all appropriate professional development 3 opportunities including, but not limited to, the quality rating and 4 5 improvement system, the early childhood education and assistance 6 program, and the early support for infants and toddlers program. 7 purpose of the core competencies is to serve as a foundation for what early care and education professionals need to know and do to provide 8 9 quality care for children. The core competencies must be reviewed and updated every five years. 10
